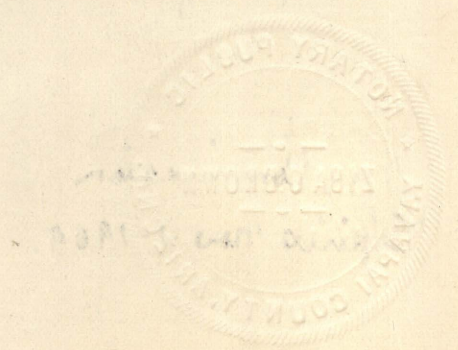

FIELD NOTES OF SURVEY

A. B. Kellogg Homestead Listing Application,
Prescott National Forest.

Situated in Bloody Basin on Red Creek, at the Zig Zag spring, 23 miles in a southeasterly direction from Cordes postoffice; approximately in Sec. 10, T. 9 N., R. 5 E. G. & S.R.B.& Mer. Unsurveyed.

Variation: This survey was run and plotted on a variation of 13° 45' E., as recommended by the Phoenix land office.

The survey is tied to U. S. Forest Service monument, also serving as corner No. 1 and initial point of survey; situated upon south side of trail leading from the Zig Zag cabin to the Basin cabin, at point where trail crosses Red Creek; a malpais rock 30" x 26" x 14", chiseled FSMH1, set in ground 12", and held in place by a stone monument 3' x 3' x 3'. Zig Zag spring bears N. 60° E., 1.23 chains. An ash tree 18" in diameter, scribed MHW1 in blaze, bears N. 65° E., 82 chains, and an ash tree 20" in diameter, scribed MHW1 in blaze, bears S. 79° E., .39 chains.

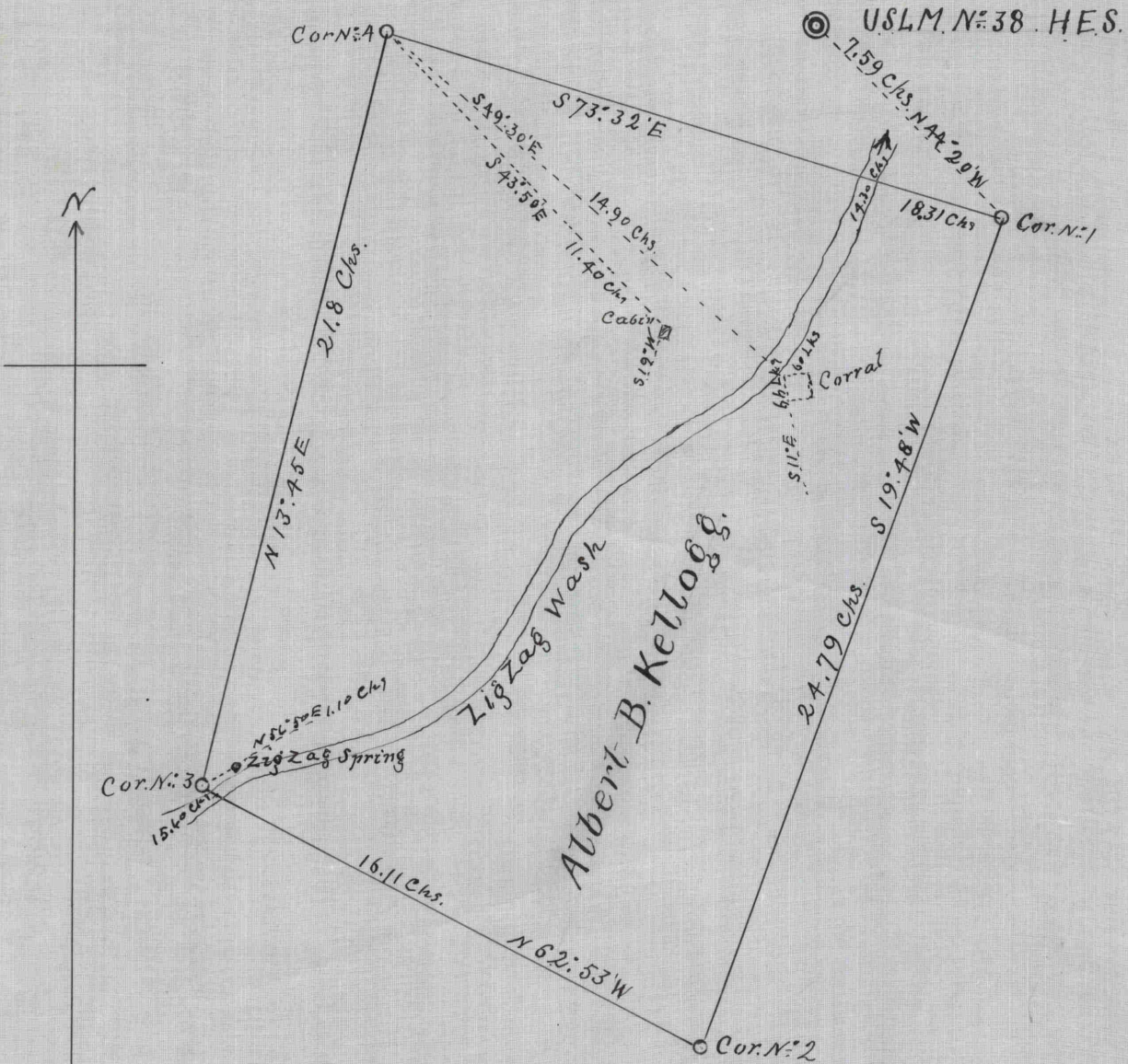
