bottom land and extending onto the hills on both sides.

Adjoining Claims.

joining is unclaimed ground of the Tonto National Forest.

Report.

The south ¼ Cor. of Sec. 36, T. 12° N., R. 9° E., is a lime-
stone projecting 12x20x20 ins. above the ground in a
mound of stone, chiseled ¼ on the north face.

The discrepancies between these notes and the notes of
the survey by the Agricultural Department are due to
errors in the latter.

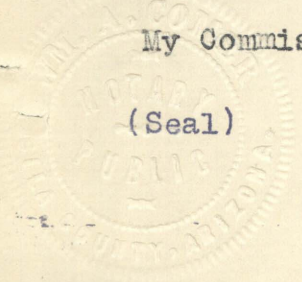
