Beginning at Cor. No. 1 on line 4-5 Webfoot Lode Sur. and N. 47° 59' W. 11.43 chs. from Cor. No. 4, 8.82 chs. No. 1862, S. 47° 59' E. 581.8 ft. from Cor. No. 5, of said lode

and on line H4-H5 of the preliminary survey, a granite boulder in place 24-24-6 inches exposed with a substantial mound of stone alongside; chiseled 1-HES-69 on top with X for exact corner point, from which,

The corner to sections 22-23-26-27 T. 13 N. R. 2 W. brs. N. 25° 55' E. 14.21 chs. Cor. H5 of the preliminary survey brs. N. 36° 55' E 0.58 chs., being a rock in place 2-2-1 ft. exposed and chiseled H5-x.

Corner 3 of this survey is within the listing survey and was established to take the place of a standing tree Cor. No. H-6, as I do not think a tree is as good for a cor as a stone.

Corner No. 1 was established due to the conflict existing in the listing survey, and the Webfoot Mining claim Sur. No. 1862, so that said conflict could be eliminated. Cor. No. H-1 of listing survey fell on patented land.

LOCATION.

This survey is located in Secs. 26-27, T. 13 N. R. 2 W. of the G. & S. R. B. & M. within the Prescott National Forest

Yavapai County Arizona, and ^{is} embraced within the area described in the listing and entry.

ADJOINING CLAIMS

The Webfoot Mining Claim, patented, Peter Mackin claimant, is situated on the northeast of this survey and joins it at Cor .No.1

A forty acre tract designated as the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec.27, T.13 N.R. 2 W. and owned by Mr.Wm.N.Kelly, is situated on the south of this survey but does not join same.

IMPROVEMENTS

A frame house, dwelling, the north gable of which brs. S.69-42'E. 4.17 chs. from Cor.No.8. The main part of this house is 24 x 12 $\frac{1}{4}$ ft. and two story, with shingle roof On the west is attached a wing 36 x 12 ft, one story, with shingle roof. There are porches on the east, northwest corner and south side of the building. An 18 foot well is at the edge of the south porch of the wing.

A buggy and wood shed the northwest cor. of which brs.S.66-03'E. 2.70 chs. from Cor.No.8. This building is frame one story building with flat sheet iron roof, and 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 25 ft. in dimensions.

~~No.3~~

A chicken Coop, the northwest corner of which brs. S.50-44'E. ^{2.05}~~3.07~~ chs. from corner No.8. This building is a frame one story building with flat sheet iron roof and is 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 32 $\frac{1}{4}$ ft in dimensions.

A stable, the northwest corner of which brs. S.62-57'E. 1.20 chs. from corner No.8. This building is a frame one

story building with sheet iron roof and is $13\frac{1}{4}$ x $29\frac{1}{2}$ ft. in dimensions.

No. 5

A blacksmith shop, the northwest corner of which bears S. 43° -40'E, from Cor. No. 8. This building is a frame one story house with flat sheet iron roof, and is 9 x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ft in dimensions. This shop is fairly well equipped

No. 6

A smoke house, the northwest cor. of which bears S. 58° -14'E. 4.55 chs from cor. No. 8. This building is a frame one story house with a cellar 5x6 ft. underneath. It has a gable roof of corrugated iron and is $8\frac{1}{2}$ x $10\frac{1}{4}$ ft. in dimensions.

No. 7

A post corral, the center of which bears S. 85° -15'E. from Cor. No. 8. 3.06 chs. This corral is made of posts set upright in the ground and side to side, and 60 ft. in diameter.

A patch of alfalfa, a small orchard, a garden and a patch of corn are the principal agricultural assets of this homestead survey.

INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Leitz light Mountain transit-theodolite Model 13, No. 5929. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by use of a solar attachment. The distances were measured with a 150 ft. and 300 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT

I find that the distance from the point for Cor. No. 4 Webfoot Sur. N. 1862 to Cor. No. 5 is N. 47° -59'W, 1336.1 ft. ^{20.25 chs,} instead of N. 47° -52'W. 1318.0 ft. The point for corner was determined by course and distance from a standing corner No. 3 of the Webfoot claim, as given in the special instructions.

I do not agree or close with the tie for Cor. No. 1 of the Webfoot, ^{10 chs} to Cor to Sec. 22-23-26-27 T. 13 N. R. 2 W.

These discrepancies are due to errors in the returns of the prior surveys.

Corners No. 3 and 5 of ^{to be} Webfoot_A are properly set and marked. Corner No. 4 is obliterated due to county road passing over the spot but the point for corner as established by me is exact to the degree of accuracy required for mineral surveys.

Cor No. 5 of the ~~listing~~ survey fell within the Webfoot mining claim, so a new corner was established as per special instructions covering that point.

The distance from the East $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. Sec. 27 to the Cor. to sec.

22-23-26-27 is N. 2-43'E. 40.52 chs.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. between Sec. 26 and 27 is a mound of stone from which a pine tree with the proper bearing tree marks brs. N. 75° W. 24 links.

The corner to sections 22-23-26-27 is a monument of stone at the base of a pin oak stump, having no bearing trees as per field notes to that effect.

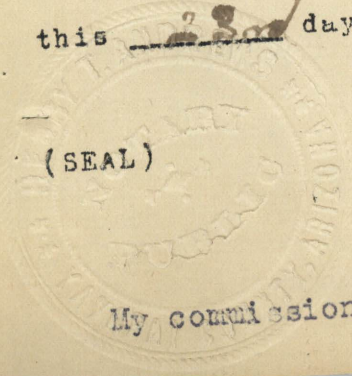

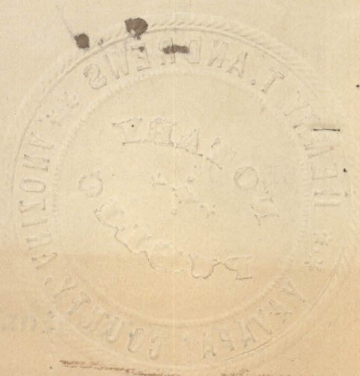

Prescott National Forest.

Situated on Groom Creek about $\frac{3}{4}$ miles west of Post-office and three chains from where the Senator road crosses Groom Creek. In approximately Sections ~~26~~²⁷, T. 13 N., R. 2 W., G. & S. R. B. & Mer.

This survey was run and plotted on a variation of 13° ~~45'~~ E. as used by Local Mineral Surveyors in this section.

The survey is tied to Corner No. 3 of the Webfoot claim Survey No. 1862.

Thence N. 90° W. 6.55 chains to Corner No. 1 and initial point of survey, a rock $20'' \times 10'' \times 6''$, chiseled H1 set in ground and held in place by stone monument $3' \times 3' \times 3'$. 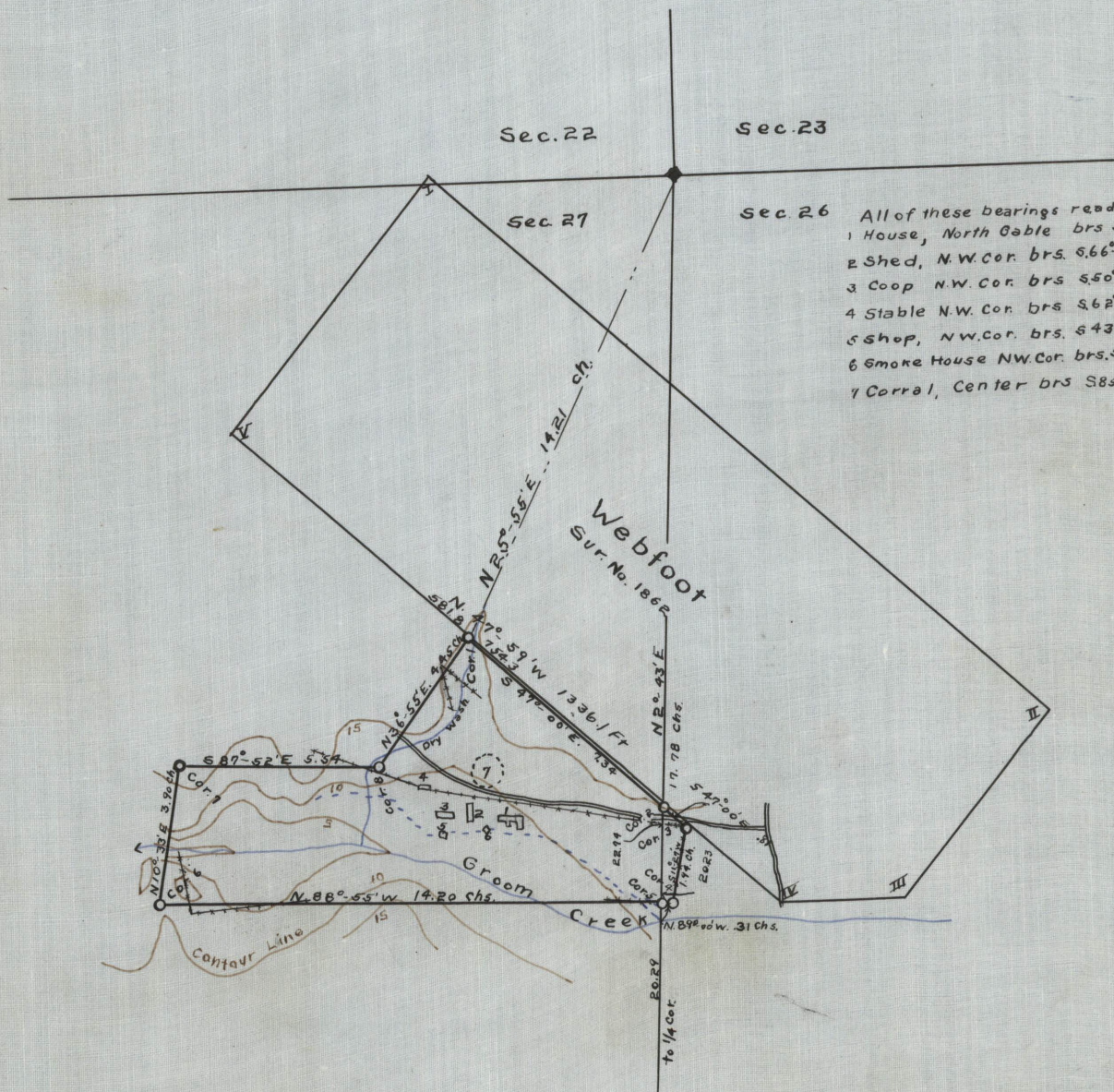
