This survey was made with a Gurley Transit. The courses were deflected from the meridian established by observation on Polaris. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

I checked line 7-1 HES-No. 62 by the above established meridian it gave N19°11'E.

I rechecked this line and found the distance to be 6.26 chs.

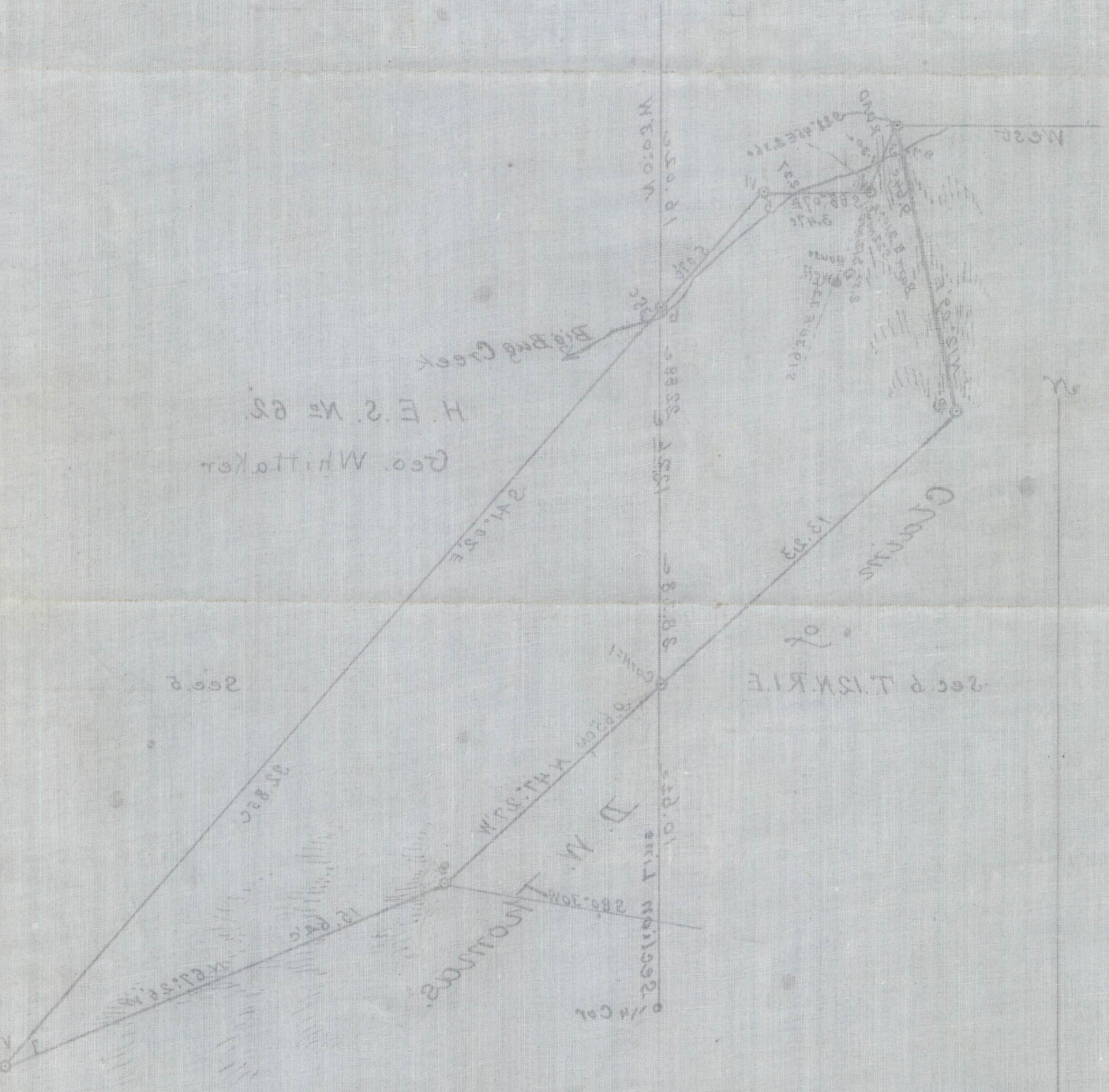
HOMESTEAD ENTRY SURVEY No 76.
