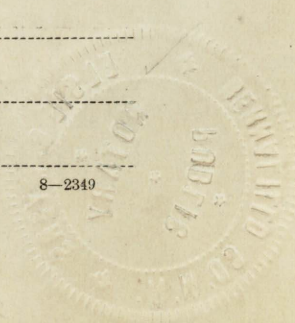

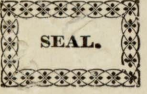

Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona dated November 8, 1913 and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 126.

Located in secs. 5 and 8, surveyed T. 10 N., R. 10 E., of the Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, within the Tonto National Forest, Arizona.

Surveyed under the Acts of June 11, 1906 and March 4, 1913.

Survey commenced January 3, 1914 and executed with a W. and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit, the least count of all arcs of which is one minute.

The distances were measured with a 200 link steel tape directly on the slope and the slope angles determined with a clinometer.

At 3h. 00m. p.m., l.m.t., at cor. secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9, T. 10 N., R. 10 E., observe the sun for azimuth. The reading on cor. secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, which is in sight is set at zero. The sun is observed in the upper left quadrant of the field with telescope direct and in the lower right quadrant with telescope reversed.
