Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona, dated October 1, 1914 and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 269.

Situated in secs. 31 and 36, T. 19 S., Rs. 30 and 31 E., unsurveyed, and secs. 1 and 6, T. 20 S., Rs. 30 and 31 E., survey approved, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Chiricahua National Forest, Arizona.

Surveyed under the Acts of June 11, 1906 and June 30, 1914.

Survey commenced May 31, 1915, and executed with a Buff and Buff transit No. 9699, equipped with Smith solar attachment.

I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections:

The stadia is adjusted to read 1:132.

All measurements were made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape and the slope angles were determined with a clinometer, the horizontal distances alone appearing in these notes.

May 31, 1915.

At the cor. to Ts. 19 and 20 S., Rs. 30 and 31 E., hereinafter described, I set the horizontal limb of my transit to read at zero and sight to Polaris with the telescope direct, and at 6h. 37.6m. p.m., l.m.t., I unclamp the plate and turn off an angle of 57° 04' 40" from Polaris to the East to a prominent mark on a moun-

At 8h. 00m. a.m., l.m.t., I set off $21^{\circ} 58-1/2'$ N. on decl. arc, and $31^{\circ} 44-1/2'$ on the lat. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. to secs. 1, 6, 31 and 36, Ts. 19 and 20 S., Rs. 30 and 31 E.,

The solar attachment by a.m. and p.m. observations defines positions for meridian 13" East and 3" West of the meridian established from polaris observations; therefore, I conclude that the adjustments of my solar is in satisfactory condition.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This claim is located in a wide level valley, surrounded by high mountains, affording excellent protection for cattle in the winter.

About 1/2 acre is planted to orchard, the remainder being used for pasture.

The soil is a brown adobe, and by irrigation could be made to produce good crops, but the claim is more suitable for a stock ranch than farming, for which purpose it is now being used.

There is a heavy stand of oak timber in the SW. cor. and a scattering stand along the East boundary.

There is no evidence of mineral on the claim.

Water for domestic use and for watering about 1000 head of stock is mostly surface and is caught in tanks located on the claim. When the water in the tanks is exhausted, the windmills are brought into use and water obtained by pumping from wells.

Apache, Arizona, on the El Paso and Southwestern Railway is the nearest post office and trading place. It is about 12 miles distant in an easterly direction and is reached by a good wagon road.

DIRECTIONS.—1. Carry out calculations to two decimals only.

2. In balancing Latitudes and Departures do not obliterate or change the original figures. Put the corrected figure or figures above in red ink. Do not change the footing of the original figures, but put below them the corrected footing in red ink. The corrections for balancing fallings should be proportional to the lengths of the lines.

3. In calculations of fallings take result to nearest link. In calculations of N. and S. areas drop all after second decimal. Surveyors are required to use the Standard Field Tables issued by the G. L. O.

4. Only three copies of this tabulation are necessary, for the District Office, the Surveyor General, and the Commissioner.


