## Chains

Applicant for listing, George M. Myce; Application No. 62, dated February 24, 1907; List No. 805, dated December 16, 1907; H. E. 010596, made in the Phoenix Land Office on January 3, 1911, by Lewis Smauldon.

Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona, dated March 19, 1923, and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 634.

Situated in Secs. 1 and 12, T. 10 N., R. 20 E. (Surveyed and accepted), Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, within the Sitgreaves National Forest, Arizona.

Surveyed under the Acts of June 11, 1906, and February 26, 1923.

Survey commenced August 15, 1923, and executed with a Buff and Buff transit No. 14631, equipped with Smith solar attachment.

I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 400 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.

At the Cor. of Secs. 6 and 7, T. 10 N., R. 21 E., which is also Cor. No. 2 of this survey and Cor. No. 1 of HES. 635, hereinafter described, in Latitude  $34^{\circ}16'50''$  N., Longitude  $110^{\circ}09'36''$  W. from Forest Service Base Map at 6h 45m 36s p.m. l.m.t., I observe Polaris with telescope direct, reading an angle of  $0^{\circ}57'30''$  from star to left to tack in a stake about 10 chs. northerly of my station.

DESCRIPTION

The area embraced in this homestead is comprised mainly of open valley land, with a gentle slope to the NE. The soil is a rich sandy loam of good depth and very fertile. Approximately 140 acres of the area is suitable for agricultural purposes, of which about 40 acres are under cultivation. The rainfall must be depended upon to grow crops.

Water for domestic use is hauled from a well about 3 miles distant in a southerly direction. It is probable water could be developed on the claim or could be con-

There was no timber of commercial value on the claim.

I saw no indication of mineral on the claim.

CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS.

There are no conflicts. The claim is joined on the south and west by HES 635, covering homestead of Ollano Cordoba, and on the east by HE. 025387 of Jesse E. Jarvis, patented July 7, 1918, and HE. 024509 of J. H. Frost, patented June 2, 1919.

Linden, Arizona, the nearest postoffice, lies about 1 mile distant in a southeasterly direction.

Snowflake, Arizona, the main trading point in this vicinity, lies about 20 miles distant in a northeasterly direction and is reached by good wagon road.
