The adjustments of the transit were tested and necessary corrections made before beginning the survey.

All distances are horizontal and were made directly on the slope with a 100 ft. steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.

The courses of this survey were carried forward by sustained angulation from the meridian established by me on July 13, 1938, in connection with Exchange Survey No. 665.
