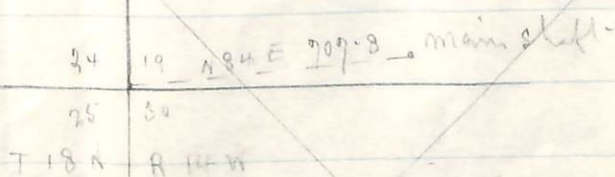

Copy of the Mining laws of
Cedar Valley District

This district shall be known as the Cedar valley District and shall be bounded as follows commencing at the lower Indian gardens on the Big Sandy and running thence West to the western base of the Wallapai range, thence Northward with said western base to the south boundary line of the Maynard district thence with said line East to the Big Sandy thence down said Big Sandy to the place of commencement

The Congressional Mining laws approved May 10th 1872, and now in force shall be the laws of this district

This district shall have a recorder who shall be required to reside in the district and who may hold office for one year from the time of his election or until his successor shall have been elected when on demand of such successor it shall be his duty to turn over in good order and without charge all books and papers appertaining to such office ~~shall~~ The recorder of this district shall be required to keep at his own expense suitable books for recording all notices or other papers required to

to be recorded and he shall be
 entitled to receive one (\$1) dollar
 for each name on each notice recorded
 by him and reasonable rates for all other
 office work and such records shall
 be subject to inspection without
 charge at all times by any person
 interested in the district but such
 inspection shall not be allowed except
 in the presence of the recorder or his deputy.

A notice conspicuously placed
 on the ground claimed thereby with the
 boundary monuments established as re-
 quired by law shall be sufficient
 to hold for (30) thirty days from the
 date thereof but if such notice be
 not recorded in such time the ground
 claimed thereby shall be subject to relocation.
