0.80 Rocky gulch running S. E

4.54 1/2 or 300 ft to S. W. cor. of Claim which is also the S. E. cor. of the Little Annie Mining Claim.

This is marked by a post in a mound of stones and witnessed by two trees. The post and trees are marked as the corner and witnessed to the S. E. cor. of the Little Annie Claim I mark two additional trees as witnesses as follows

Measurements of work done on the claim
 From the S. E. cor. of claim I run
 N. 18° 42' W. 77.3 chs to mouth of open cut
 run northeasterly to ledge, 39.60 ft. long,
 6.60 ft. wide, and 10.50 ft deep at back.
 From the mouth of this cut I run N. 50° 45' E
 1.72 chs. to S. side of shaft, 12.54 ft deep,
 and 6.60 x 9.24 ft wide. Thence I run
 N. 11° 52' E. 2.21 chs to second shaft, 6.60 ft
 deep and 7.26 x 5.28 ft wide. From the
 point on S. side of 1st shaft I run
 N. 79° 16' E. 157 chs to mouth of another
 cut, run westerly into ledge, 23.10 ft long
 5.61 ft wide and 7.26 ft deep at back.

General Description etc.

This claim — the "Oriental" located

in the Copper Mountain Mining District
 Yavapai County, Arizona — lies between
 the Little Annie Claim, which it adjoins
 on the West, and the East Fork of Shavers
 Creek. — The notice of location does not
 call for any monuments at the corners,
 but it fixes the locus of the claim so definitely, by these
 references, that I considered it sufficiently
 certain. It just takes up the whole ground
 between the Little Annie Claim and the
 Creek aforesaid, and could occupy no
 other place by what is called for in
 the location. — The surface of
 the claim is quite steep, rocky and
 broken. There is some scrub timber
 in the vicinity — Cedar and Pinon. The
 ores of the claim are copper bearing
 carrying the carbonates and oxide of this
 metal. The work done on the mine is
 in the cuts and tunnels above described
 And I hereby certify that the value
 of the improvements on the claim is
 not less than five hundred dollars and
 that they have been made by the claimant.
