The vein is of silver bearing ore containing also a small percentage of gold. The country rock is granite.

The land sloping SW is somewhat broken. Soil mineral.

The claim and country adjacent contains a fine growth of Pine and oak timber.

The work done upon this mine consists of four shafts and a cross cut as indicated by the foregoing field notes and designated upon the plat accompanying same, amounting in the aggregate to a cost of upwards of one thousand dollars.
