General Description.

This mine, situated in the District bearing its name, was discovered about 2 1/2 years ago by its present owners and sprang rapidly into prominence, as one of the richest and most promising discoveries in the Territory.

The lode is traceable for several miles, being upon surface two slightly diverging immense Iron dykes about

150 feet in thickness and from 50 to 75 feet high, standing out prominently and at once attract the eye by their imposing and lofty appearance. -

The claim is located on War-Eagle gulch 35 miles from Prescott A.T. by Trail via Soure's ditch, Crook's Cañon - Battleflat and War Eagle gulch; and 51 miles via Wagon road through the Agua Fria Valley and Hackberry flat, thence by Trail, 6 miles to mine. The "Del pasoo" and "War Eagle" Mines are about 3 miles Southwest from this claim.

The ore taken from this mine is free milling and several thousand tons have been worked and continue to be worked, the company pushing work with Energy. Up to last January when negotiations for purchase of this Mine were entered into, over \$200,000⁰⁰/₁₀₀ of Silver bullion had been extracted.
