This Mine, situated in the District bea-
ring its name, was discovered by its pre-
sent owners about 2 1/2 years ago and sprung
rapidly into prominence as being one of
the richest and most promising discoveries
in the Territory.

The ledge is traceable for several miles
being upon surface two slightly diver-
ging immense Iron dykes about 150 feet
in thickness and from 50 to 75 feet high
standing out prominently and at once
attracting the eye, by their imposing

The Claim is located on War-Eagle-Gulch 35 miles from Prescott U. T. by Trail via Louneto Ditch, Fredericks Mill, Cross-Cannon, Twitkey-Creek Station & Battleflat; and 51 miles from Prescott via Agua-Fria - Lone Pine - Hackberry Flat Wagon road, thence 6 miles by trail to Peck-Mine, being about 3 miles North-East from the "Del Pasco" Mine and War-Eagle Lode.

The ore taken from this mine is free milling and several thousand tons have been worked and continue to be reduced, the company pushing work with energy. Up to last January, when negotiations for purchase of this mine were entered into - over \$200,000⁰⁰/₁₀₀ of silver bullion had been extracted.

The area of mineral matter averages from 2 to 3 feet uniform in all Cuts or Tunnels, with a paystreak of 24 inches of exceptionally rich ore, assaying from one to twenty thousand Dollars per ton. - Only first class ore worked about 1500 tons of second-grade ore on dump assaying not less than \$150 per ton.

The Lode is located both North & South of discovery location, the 1st South "S. B. Jewell" the 2nd north "Alexander"; the "Steele" claiming on the West, with the Extensions of "Silver Prince" on the East. The country rock is principally slate & no wood in quantities of any consequence near. A few Juniper - Pine or Oaks along War-Eagle Gulch and adjacent cañons.

Timber obtained from the War-Eagle Mountain Range to which the Peck-Mining Company have built practicable

Waggonroad. Water obtained from a spring in War-Eagle gulch and a Well near mouth of Main tunnel.

A small but thriving Mining town has sprung up near Mine, called Alexandra.

Public Land Survey's not extended to vicinity of this Mine.

The work upon this Mine - the Discovery location and first North-Extension constitute the unincorporated Stock - was performed under Sec. 2324 R.S. amounting in the aggregate to over fifty thousand Dollars, consisting of the following improvements lying within the boundaries of this Survey to wit,

- 1 A Tunnel (I) 35 feet long 5 feet wide and 6 feet high not timbered
- 1 A Cut (I) 26 feet long 19 high and 4 feet wide
- 1 A Cut (II) 18 feet long 12 feet high and 5 feet wide
- 1 A Cut (III) 27 feet long 19 feet high and 4 feet wide
- 1 A Tunnel (II) 24 feet long 4 feet wide 5 feet high not timbered.
- 1 A Tunnel (III) known as North tunnel 137 feet long 6 feet high and 5 feet broad not timbered

Notice of Location of the First North Extension of the Peck lode or claim, containing mineral, and located as a silver mine.

The undersigned claims, for mining purposes, fifteen hundred (1500) feet of this quartz ledge in length along the lode or vein, and three hundred (300) feet on each side of the middle of the vein, at the surface, together with all the dips, spurs and angles, and all valuable mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges therein or appurtenant thereto, under and according to the provisions of an Act of Congress, Approved May 10th 1872, entitled "An Act to promote the development of the Mining Resources of the United States."

This claim commences at this notice which is posted in a conspicuous place in a monument standing on the lode and adjoining the discovery claim on the North, and running three North-westerly three hundred (300) feet to a stake marked "A"; thence North-Easterly fifteen hundred feet (1500) feet to a stake marked "B"; thence South-Easterly (600) feet to a stake marked "C"; thence South-Westerly (1500) feet to a stake marked "D"; thence North-westerly (300) feet to the place of beginning.
