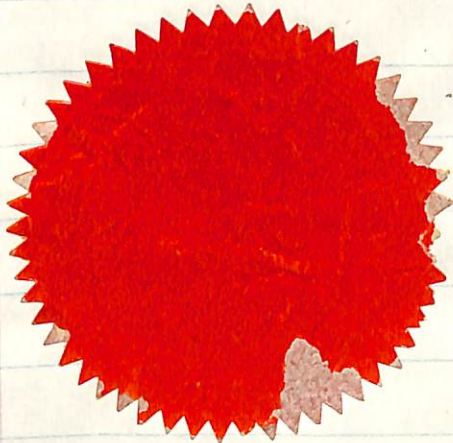

ON THE COPEL LOBE

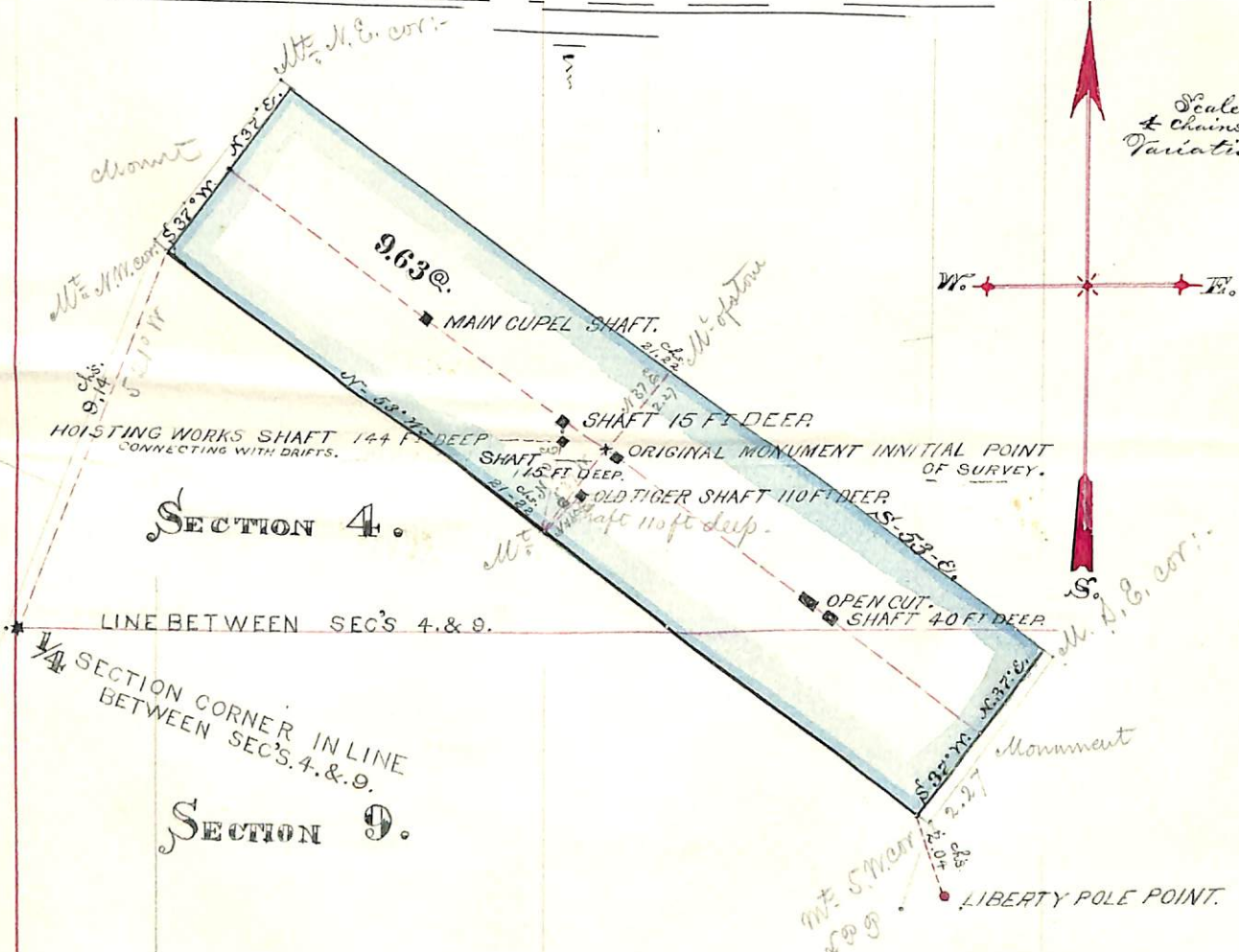
