By the original location the Head Centre claim was made to extend 1500 linear feet along the course of the ledge and 300 feet on each side of the middle thereof at the surface, but this was found to conflict with adjoining prior locations. Said conflict were however adjusted and therefore only such portion of the Head Centre as covered otherwise unclaimed ground was surveyed.
