Field Note of the Survey of the Yellow Jacket

By the original location the Yellow Jacket claim was made to extend 1500 linear feet along the course of the vein and 300 feet on each side of the middle thereof at the surface, but this was found to conflict to some extent with adjoining ^{prior} older locations. Said conflict was adjusted however and therefore only such portion of the Yellow Jacket claim as covered otherwise unclaimed ground was surveyed.

I started therefore at the Initial Monument marked A on the plat, which I select as being the most central, and run thence
N. 87° 26' E.,
