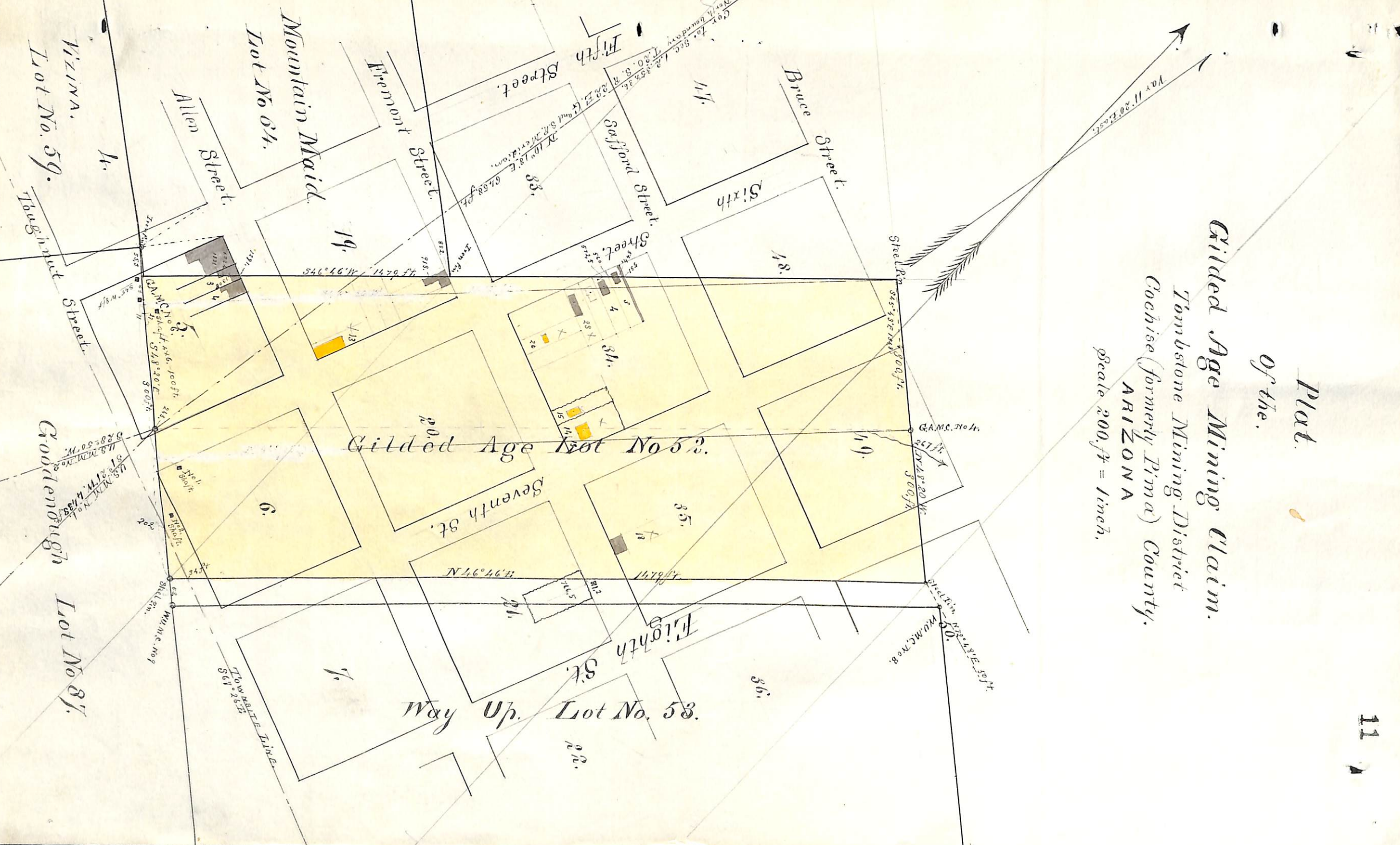


Plat

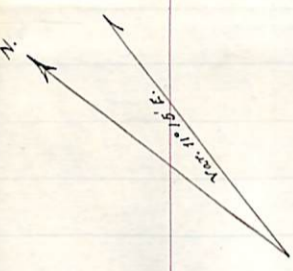

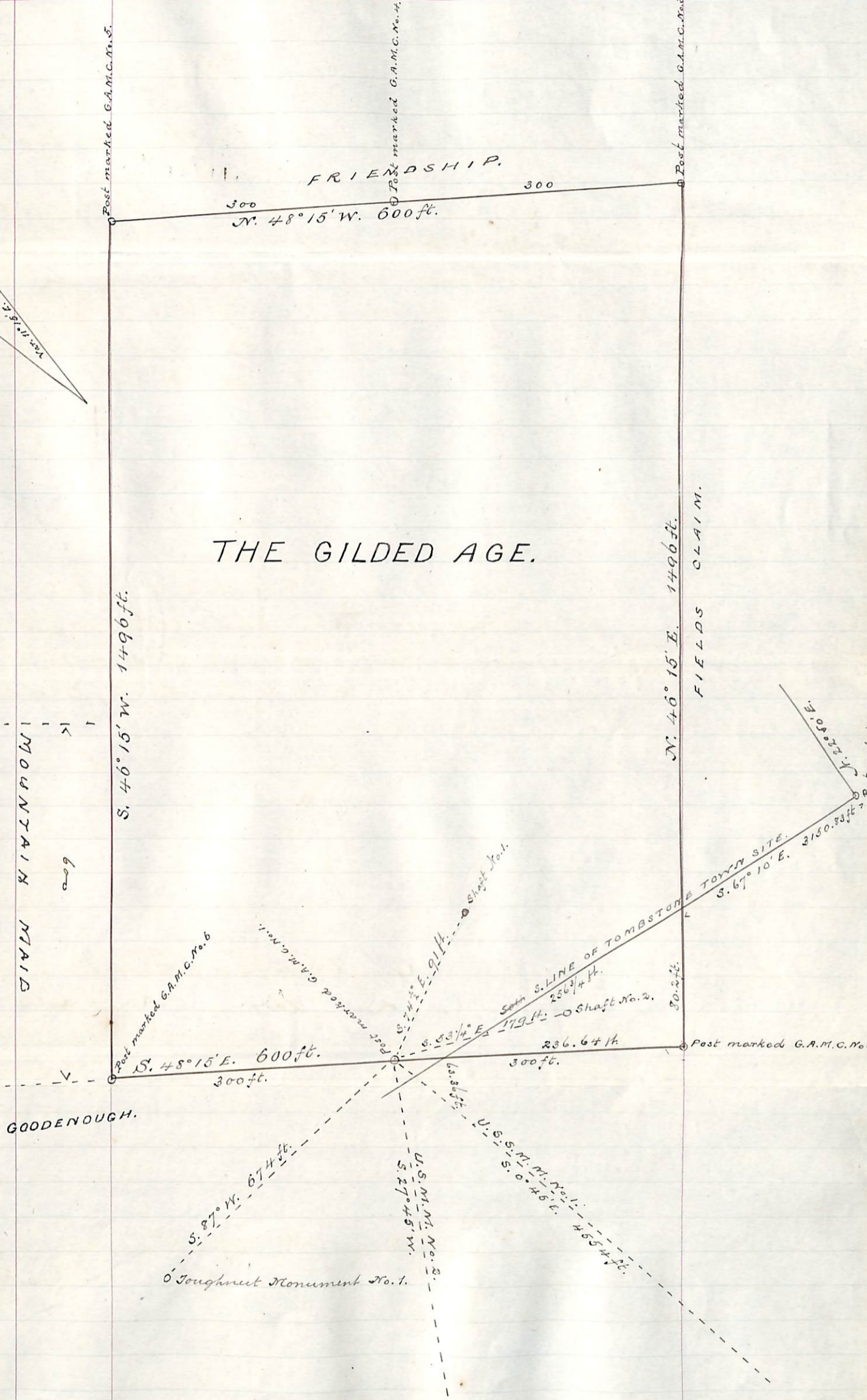
