REPORT.

The True Blue Mining claim, claimed by the Syndicate Mining Company, is situated in Tombstone Mining District, Pima County, Arizona.

The adjoining claims are the San Pedro on the east, the Oro Bell on the west and the Gordon and Three Brothers on the south.

The mining development consists of a shaft 115 feet deep, and 116 feet of drifts, 90 feet below the surface. The value of this work, done by the claimants and their grantors, may be truly estimated at not less than \$2762.

A small portion of the Gordon claim conflicts with the True Blue; but as the Gordon is owned by the claimants of the True Blue, the right of the True Blue to the portion in conflict will not probably be contested. The accompanying field notes and diagrams show the portion in conflict.
