He further says that the whole of said Yreka Mining Claim, except about two hundred feet at the North westerly end thereof is covered with a sedimentary deposit or "Wash-down" many feet in depth or thickness, and which wholly covers the ledge and mineral formation, except at the said North westerly end where alone the ledge appears at the surface and the Croppings are

visible -

Affiant further says that the said Claim was located by Vigna and Cook, as appears by the certified copy of the location notice on file with the application for patent for said Mine, but neither the said Vigna nor the said Cook are now in the Territory of Arizona, and therefore the Applicant cannot procure their Affidavits in regard to said location, but he further says that at the time the applicant, the said Vigna Consolidated Mining Company, became the owner of said Yreka Mining Claim no work had been done thereon - that the said location was determined and made from the Croppings and developments on Claims located Southeastwardly from the said Yreka Claim and the Croppings are said Northwesterly end of said Claim, ~~but controlled also by roads, streets and other things upon the surface.~~

Deponent further says that the said location of said shaft was controlled largely by roads, streets, and other circumstances of like nature, as well as by the fact that it was the proper place to sink as regarded

a ledge or lode at or near the center of
said claim; that he did

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not expect to strike the principal
ledge in sinking said shaft, but in-
tended to sink on the southerly side
of the ledge, and at a proper depth
to cross-cut to the North East to find
the ledge, and this principally for
the reason that if the shaft is sunk
so as to strike the ledge and cut
through it on its dip, that weaken-
ing the ore weakens and endangers
the shaft, which is readily affected

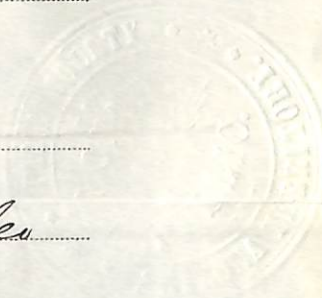
