Dear Sir,

Under your instructions bearing date of Nov 22nd 1880. I have surveyed the "Mountain Maid Mining Claim" and enclosed please find "Plat" and "Field Notes" together with the blank affidavits properly signed and sworn to.

In reply to extra instruction No 1 I would say,

Where it was possible to take bearings upon corners by means of a "flag" I did so. But where the claim was covered with buildings I used the system of triangulation.

The connections with Townsite corner, and U. S. Min. Mott were taken by actual bearing with Transit and the measurements made, dynamite of chain and plumb bob.

Reply - No 2 Where it was possible to find corner stakes showing reliable and correct corners of blocks I established the line of the block or street and then noted the intersection of the true line of the claim.

Very few of the stakes showing the street corners ^{or lot} can now be found. Therefore it is impossible to show many intersections.

I also send you duplicate samples of ore taken from the main shaft by myself.

General Description.

This claim is situate wholly within the limits of Tombstone Town Site, and lies upon a flat, which slopes toward the west, being in Pima County, Arizona.

The work done by claimants consists of two shafts. No. 1 is situate 438 feet from the S.W. corner of claim. It is a single compartment shaft, 4x6 feet and has been sunk on an incline of about 10° to a depth of 63 feet. The incline has followed the ledge which has an average width of about 7 inches, until a depth of 50 feet is reached when it begins to get wider. Expense of sinking shaft, about \$100 per foot.

The other shaft No. 2 being sunk at present on Lot 4, Block 4, T. S. S. It is a double compartment shaft, 6x8 feet, and at the present date has reached the depth of 52 feet. Much mineral stained rock has been taken from this shaft, but no defined ledge has yet been found.

Nearly every "lot" of the Townsite, on the eastern half of this claim, has a structure of some kind built upon it, many of them being expensive and elegant buildings, about half of which are frame, while the others are built of adobe.

About one third of the "lots" on the western half of the claim are built-upon, but the majority of the buildings, consist of small frame cabins.

It is impossible to estimate the value of all these buildings, erected upon the surface of the Mountain Maid Mining Claim.


