Field Notes of survey of the Esperanza Mine Pima District

Pima Co. A. J. Under instruction sur. Genl. dated Jan 27, 1881

U. S. Mineral Monument No 1 established by authority ^{of} January 28th 1881 in Pima Mining District, Pima Co, Arizona Territory.

Said monument is situated on top of a high and conspicuous ridge of basaltic porphyry formation, centrally located in the mineral belt. At the apex of said ridge is a ledge of basaltic porphyry permanent in place rising 2 ft above ground which I selected as the most suitable place for the monument and upon which I engraved the following letters and figures viz: on side bearing S. E. - verticle in position - U. S. M. M. - No 1, on side bearing N. angle of 50° elevation JAN 28 1881; on side bearing S. W. angle of 30° elevation - P. M. D. Drilled a hole $\frac{3}{4}$ " dia, 1 inch deep in same to designate initial point; from which a rock permanent in place projecting 2 ft above ground bears N. 16° 5' W. 112 ft 11" dist,; engraved on side of same facing the monument the letters U. S. W. M. (witness mark). A rock permanent in place projecting 2 1/2 ft above ground facing the S. bears S. 12° 30' E. 21 ft 5" dist,; engraved on same the letters U. S. W. M. S. E. cor, of Campbells boarding house bears S. 17° E. Original location monument of the Esperanza Mine - center of S. westerly end of claim - bears S. 28° 15' E. Upon initial point, set a live oak post 5 1/2 ft high hewed 6" square; marked same on N. side U. S. M. M. No 1. On E. side - P. M. D. On S. side U. S. M. M. on W. side JAN 28 1881. 
