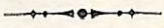

S. M. M. No 2, in the location notice, and would have made an excess in length of claim.

The South end center was in excess of 750 feet from Initial monument and has been moved to proper distance

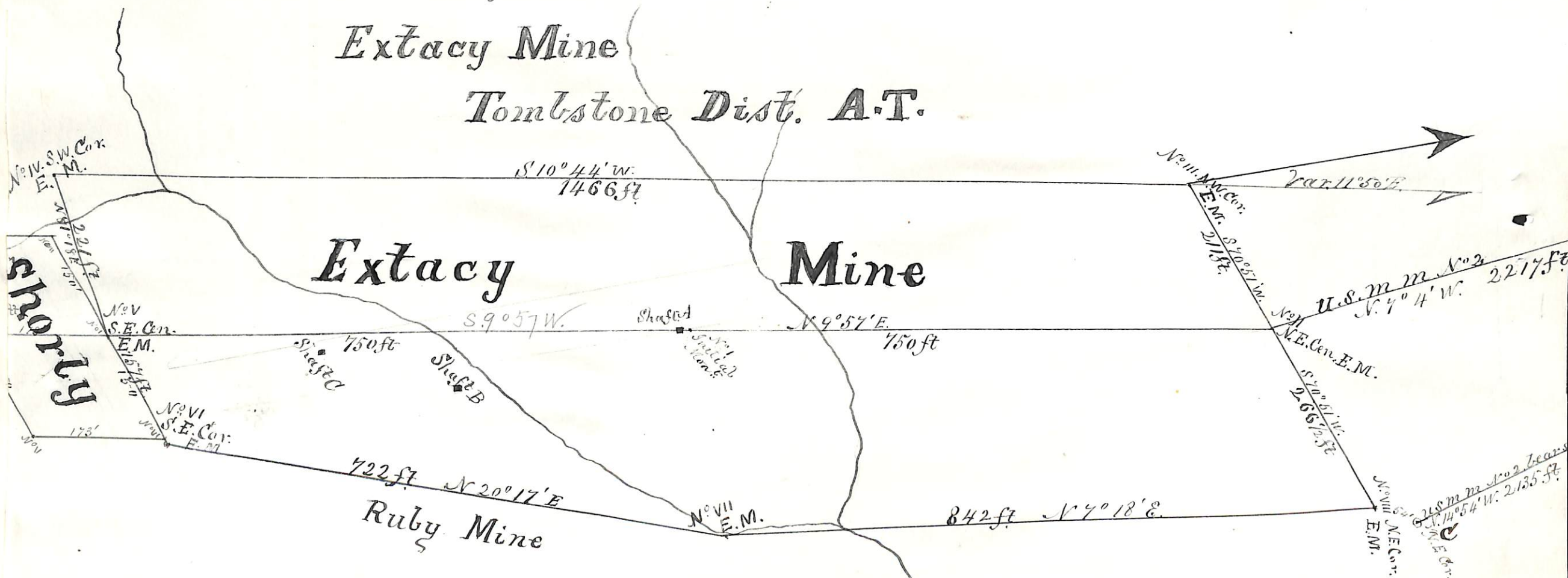
