Upon the application of the "Caboronoco Mining Company", by its agent and Superintendent A. L. Fowler to survey and define the boundaries of the "San Diego" mining claim, situate in Tombstone Mining District, County of Cochise, Territory of Arizona, and having received a warrant for the survey of the said claim from Hon John Wasson Surveyor General for the Territory of Arizona, dated August 8th A.D. 1881 and also at the same time received duly authenticated copies of the original and amended or supplemental notices of location of said claim (which said copies are hereto attached and herewith transmitted) and having tested my chain and found it to conform to the requirements of law, and having my transit in perfect adjustment, I compared it with the True Meridian established January 18 & 19th A.D. 1881, and found the variation to be $11^{\circ} 53'$ E I then proceeded to initial monument of claim, and commenced and completed the survey of said claim on the 17th day of August A.D. 1881 as set forth in the following,


