Field Notes of U.S. Mineral Monument No 1 San Pedro

Pedro District. Pinal Co A. T. Established Jan 26. 1882
By Solon M. Allis U. S. Dep Surveyor.

On summit of long ridge dist about three miles N.W. of Cotton Wood Spring and about fourteen miles N of Willow Spring I dug a hole in rotten Sphenite Rock ten feet deep and drove an iron pipe $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch in dia one foot long its full length into the rock. Over this I set a Cedar Post six inches in dia at its foot squared 4 inches in dia at top 11 feet high - Marked U. S. Min Mon No 1 San Pedro dist. setting post two feet in the ground and built a monument of stones four feet high and four feet in diameter from which

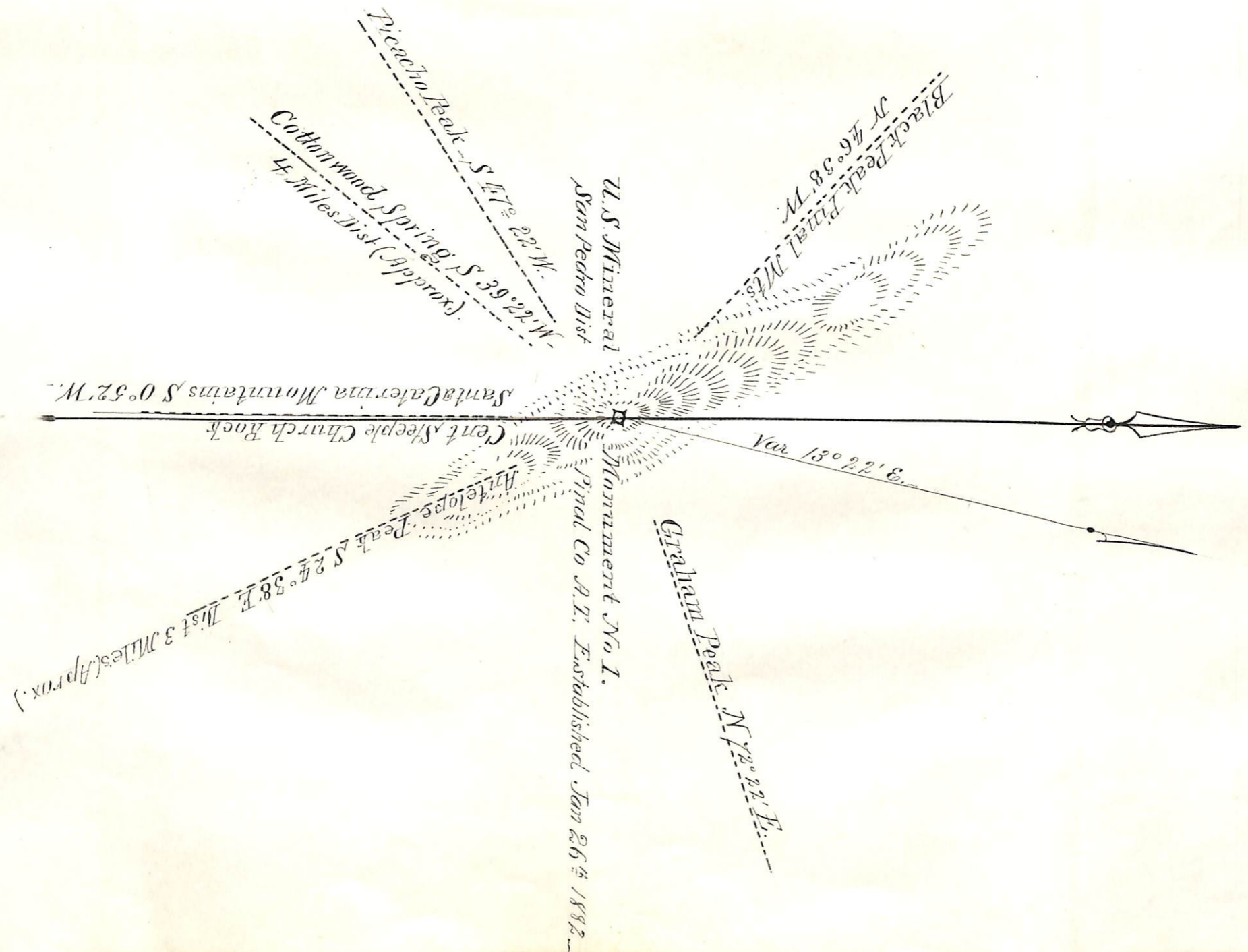

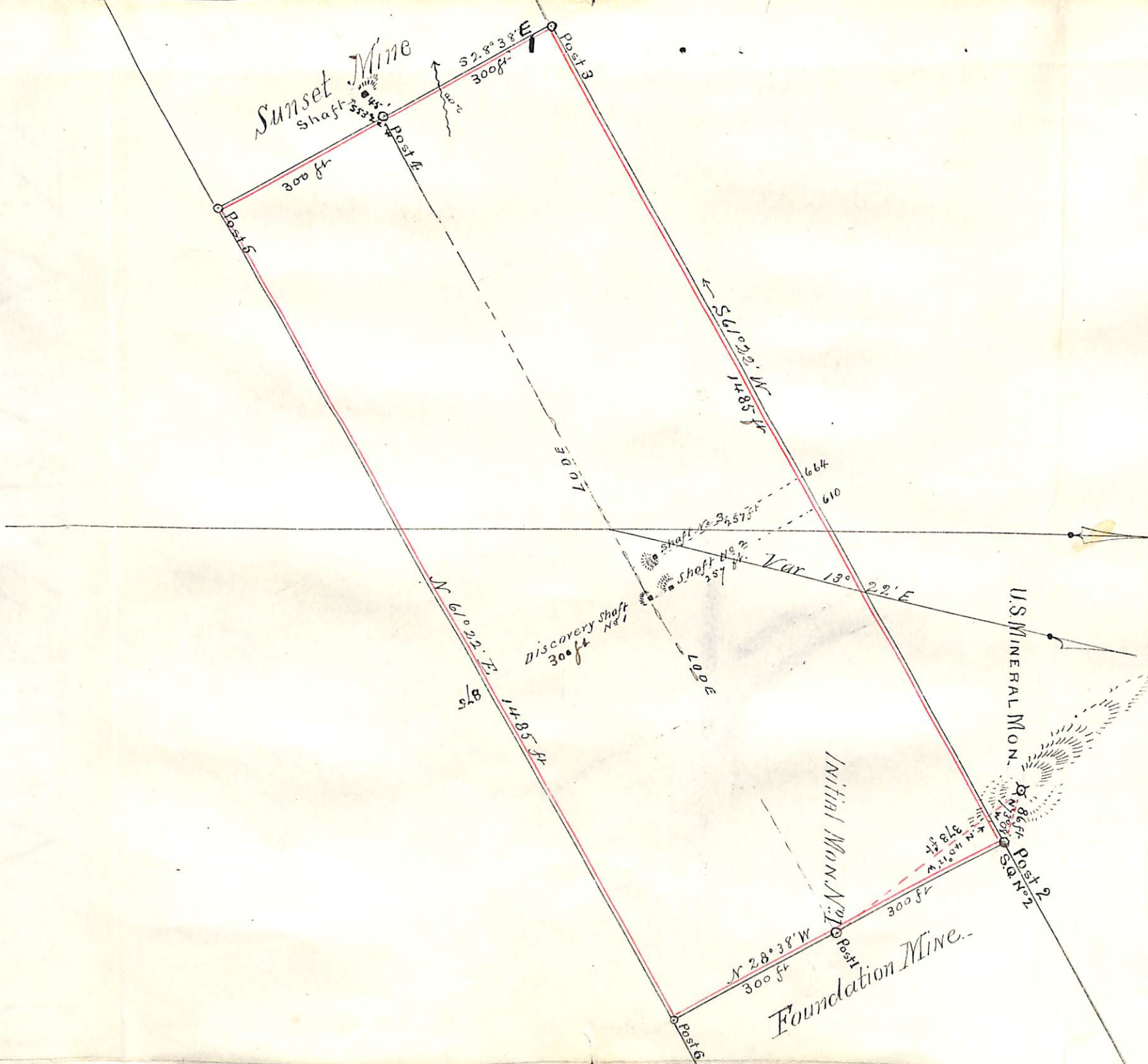

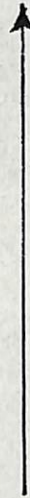
