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# Report of the Establishment of U.S. Mineral

Monument No 2. Peck Mining District  
Yavapai County Arizona

The Triumvirate Mining Claim and others in its vicinity being more than three miles distant from the U.S. Mineral Monument No 1 in Peck Mining District I established U.S. Mineral Monument No 2 for the same District as follows. On the highest point of the NE spur of Porphyry Mountain one half mile NE from its summit I build a monument of stone 5 ft high by 5x5 ft at the base on E side of which and 5 ft distant a quartzite boulder projects above the ground 3 ft high by 3 ft long by 2 ft wide on E face of same I mark U.S. M M No 2 P M D with letters 3 1/2 ins long and 1/8 in deep. From this monument the trail to Alexandra bearing NE and SW bears N 35 ft distant, and monument No 2 establishing SW Cor of Triumvirate Mining claim bears N 56° 30' E 82 ft dist.

Several other Mining claims are in the vicinity of this U.S. Mineral Monument most prominent among which are the "Duplicate" one fourth mile NE and two locations on the "Wallace" lode about one half mile east.

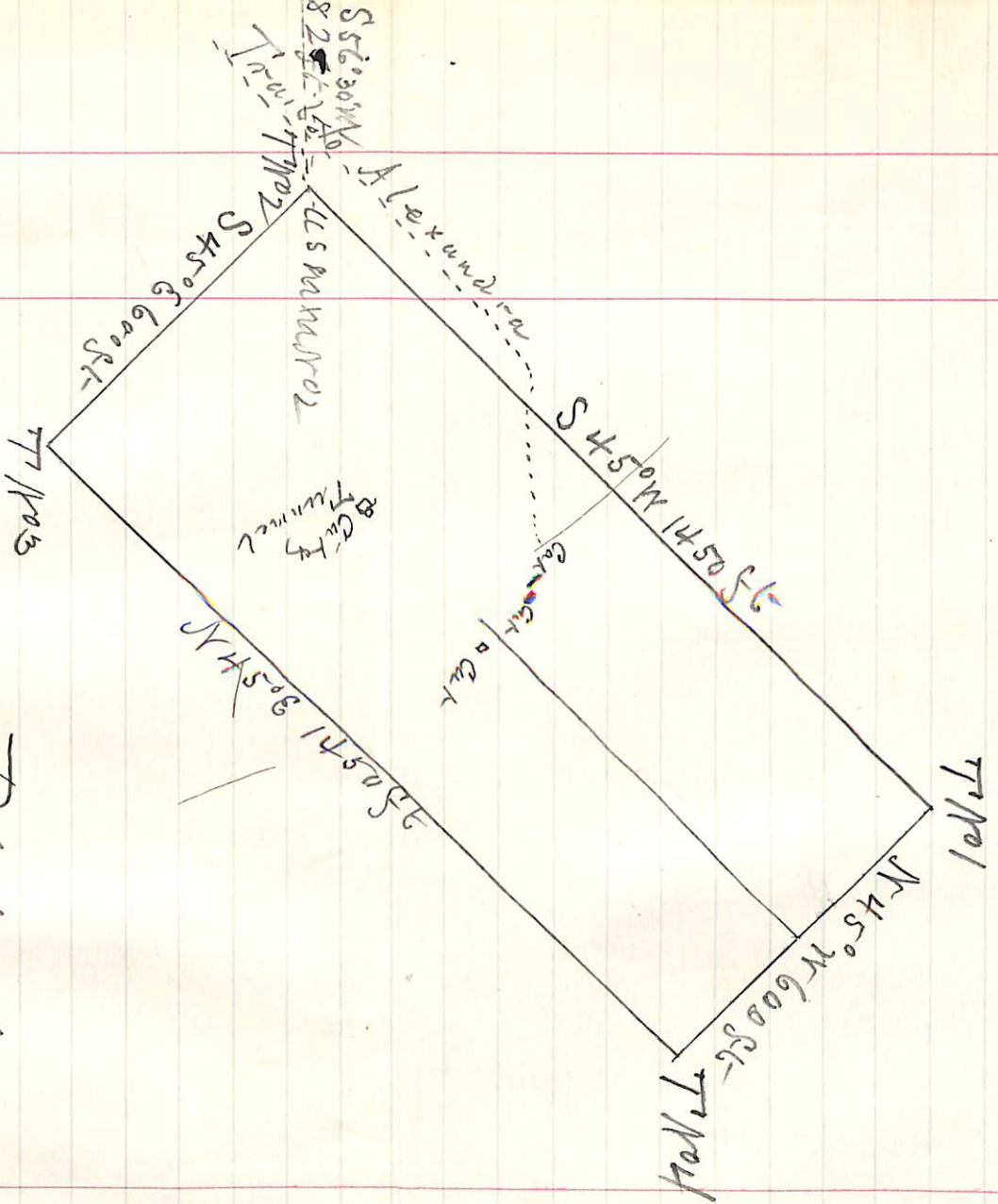
