On the Backbone at South end
of a long hill a Spur sloping
from Mount Baldy No. II. in the
Santa Rita Range of Mountains,
I plant a Pine Post 3+4 in. sqd.
8 ft. long, in Mound of stone 5 ft.
high, and 6 ft. base, built square
and mark on the Post. U. S. M.
No. 1. U. D. from which
Mt Baldy No. 1. bears N. $62^{\circ} 20' E$.
U. S. M. No. III. +++ Tindall Dist.
