## Descriptive

This claim is situate upon the west-slope of the ridge of hills, and about midway between "Naumkeag" and "Lucky Cuss" hills; on which are situate, U. S. M. M's - Nos. "1" and "2" - all in Tombstone Mining District - Cochise County, Arizona.

It is bounded on the west by the Independence M.C. (Lot No 108)

On the north by the San Rafael M.C.

On the east by the Alta M.C. (Lot No 109)

And on the south and east by the Trinity M.C.

This survey is identical with the "Amended Location Notice" of the Arant Sally Mining Claim" furnished from Office of U. S. Surveyor General, and the monuments on the ground, were verified by one of the Locators, as being the original ones that marked the boundaries, of the claim embraced by said Location Notice. ## "Improvements"

The Improvements on this claim made by the applicants, and their grantors consist of: "two shafts, and one cut."

"Shaft No 1" is 4x6 feet on the surface, and 33 ft deep.

"Shaft No 2" is sunk upon an incline to a depth of 37 feet, and is 4x6 feet on the surface.

The "cut" is 4 feet wide, and has been run upon the ledge twelve feet, having a face of 5 feet in height.

The croppings are prominent in many places through the center of the mine, appearing within a few feet of the center of south end, while the north end center <sup>mount</sup> is built directly upon the croppings of the ledge.



The Township Lines, of T. 20. S. - R. 22. E. - G. + S. R. M., within which this Claim is situated, are about two miles distant, - North - and East, and the rough hills of the surrounding country, would render it impossible to run an accurate line, for connection, at so great a distance. I therefore connected my survey with "U.S. M. M. No 1" by course and distance; also with "U.S. M. M. No 2" by course, which definitely establishes its locus.

I hereby certify that the improvements made upon the "County Sully Mining Claim" by the Claimants, and their grantors, exceed in value the amount of Five Hundred Dollars.

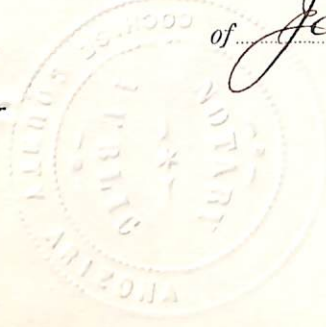

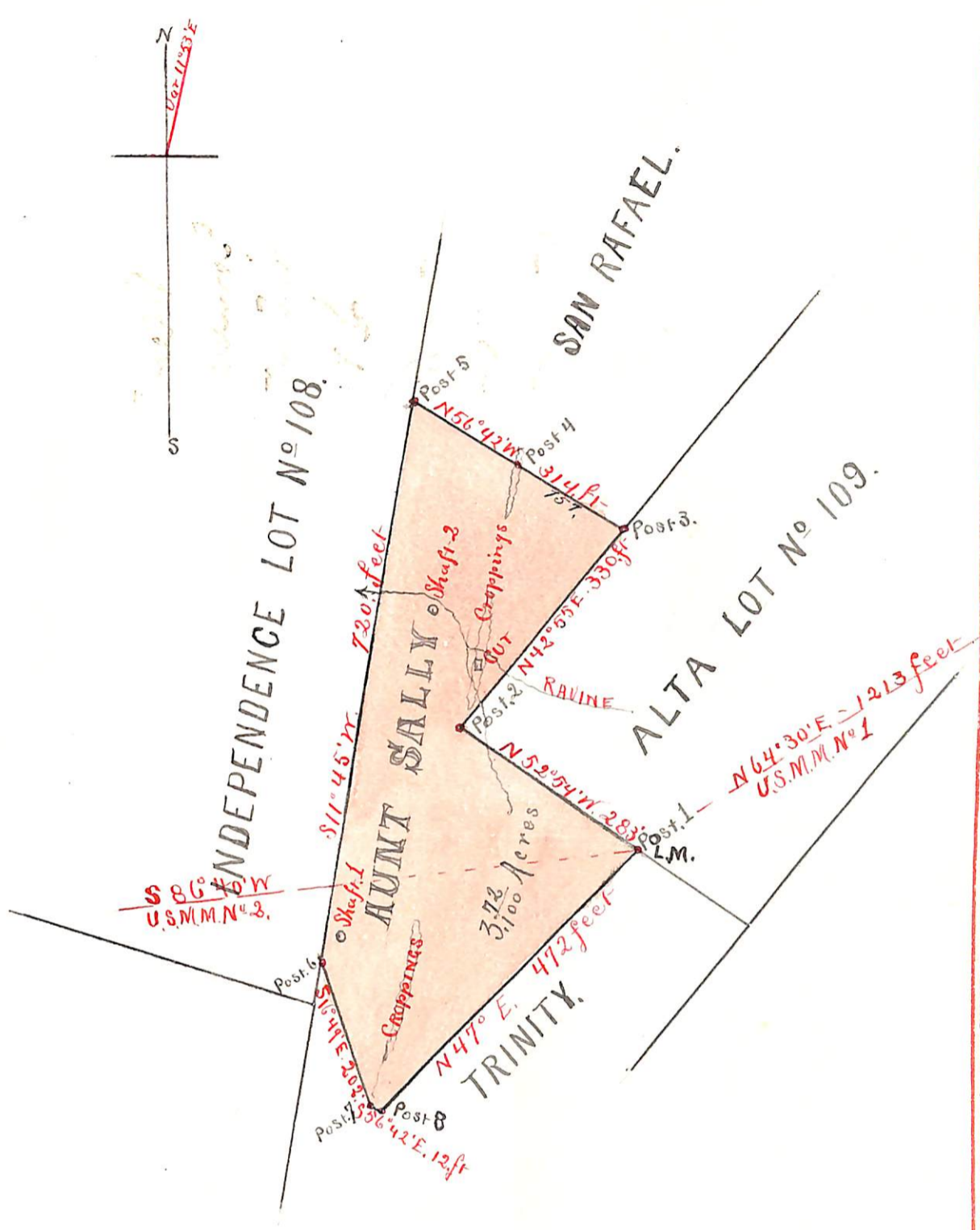


