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Survey of the General Lee Mine Situated in Cedar Valley
Michigan District, Mohave County, Arizona.

Establishment of Mineral Monument:

As there was no Mineral Monument established within several miles of this mine and as no township or section lines had been run within a like distance with which to connect my survey I proceeded to establish such a monument before commencing the survey of the General Lee Mine.

I selected as a convenient and prominent - natural object in the vicinity of numerous mines of the district - a large granite boulder of more than a hundred tons weight - situated conspicuously on a ledge near the North end of the mine and immediately to the right of the trail leading from The Hoopden Mill through Cedar Valley Pass to De Luge Wash. The Boulder is circular in form fully eighteen feet in circumference and stands solitary exposing eight feet of solid granite above the surface.

Upon the Western face of this Boulder I cut with a steel-chisel the following inscription: -
"U.S. M.M. No. 1, C.D.R. VIIV. DIST.

EST. MARCH 15th 1883"

for United States Mineral Monument,
~~Established March 15th 1883, No. 1;~~
Cedar Valley District,
Established March 15th 1883.

The first letter of the inscription (U) is the trigonometrical point of reference. There being no trees nor rocks in place near at hand to be used as bearing objects, from this point -

Take the following observations on adjacent - Mountain Peaks: -

Bates Peak bears N. $110^{\circ} 4' E$

Arnolds " " N. $51^{\circ} 19' W$.

Pilgrims Mountain brs S. $58^{\circ} 16' W$.

Yelomous Peak brs S. $15^{\circ} 16' W$.

Falvas' Butte brs S. $19^{\circ} 5' E$

Using a Burt's Solar Compass (Gurley's make) I found the Latitude to be $34^{\circ} 39' N$. and the variation of the needle to be $14^{\circ} 15' E$.

Beginning at a Monument of Stone mentioned in the Notice of Location as marking the center of the North end of the claim where I found location notice, I plant $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in the ground a granite post 8×12 inches and 26 inches long marked "G. L. No 1" "J. M." for General Lee, number one, initial Monument; and build alongside a mound of stone $4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ - base $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet high.

From this post an open cut 6×12 feet long and 10 feet deep bears S $3^{\circ} 33' E$ 460 feet distant; A shaft 6×6 ft - 12 feet deep brs S. $32^{\circ} 33' E$, 528 feet distant; A shaft 6×8 feet - 100 feet deep brs S. $3^{\circ} 33' E$ 609 feet distant.

Thence I run using a Burt's Solar Compass N. $86^{\circ} 27' E$ on ascending ground

In making the foregoing survey I was guided exclusively by the solar apparatus of my instrument. The local attraction was such as to render the needle useless, and I give the variation as above $14^{\circ} 15' E$ as the best average I could get - for the locality after having made numerous experiments.

Field Notes of the Survey of the General Lee Mine

General Description.

This claim is situated on the western slope of a mountain the pronounced feature of which is Bates' Peak. The surface covered with a dense growth of Chaparral, oak, and cut-claw bushes, descends rapidly from the north and the east. The Eastern Boundary lies along the foot of the mountain that is bordered by Mineral Gulch - the best-known Gulch of the district. The Claim is bounded on the north by the "Arnold" and on the South by the "Hubbard Consolidated" Claims.

The improvements, as located in the foregoing notes, consist of one open cut - 12 feet long 10 feet deep, one shaft - 12 and another 100 feet deep and a tunnel 5 + 7 feet - 130 feet long. The whole greatly exceeding five hundred dollars in value all of which were made by the Claimants or their grantors as I do hereby certify

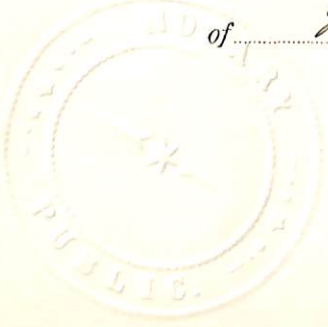

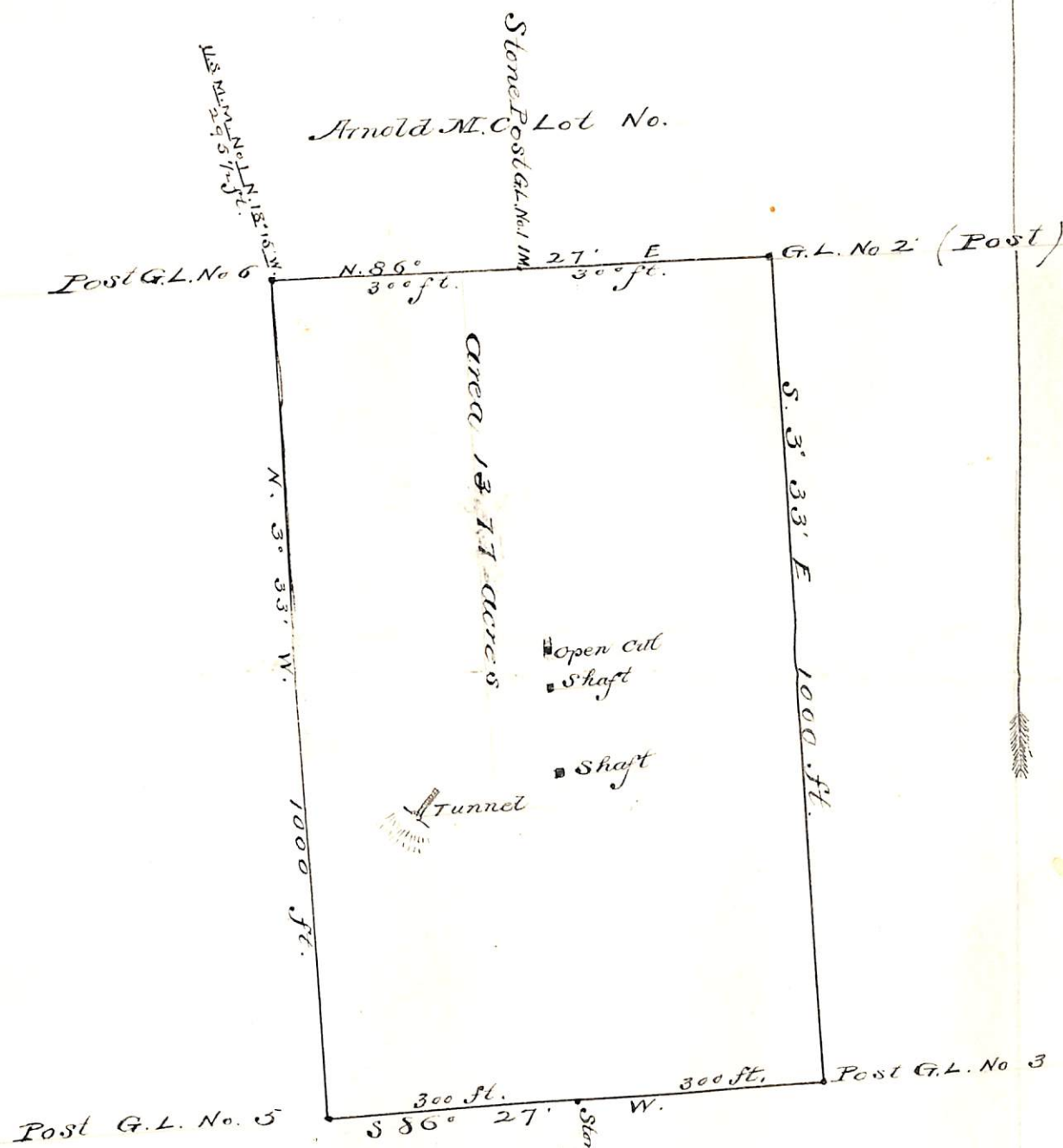
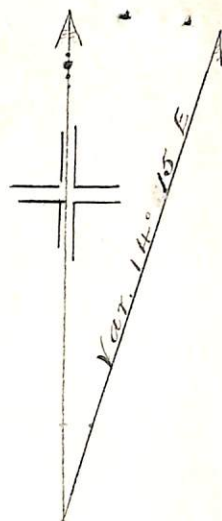
