By comparing the bearing of my Instrument, with the Standard Meridian, established in Lombstone District - Jan 19th 1881. under Instructions from the U.S. Surveyor General, I find the variation of the needle to be 11° 53' East, East being Improved Engineers Transit. -

Descriptive.

The Prompter Mining Claim is situated on the north slope of the first hill south of Lucky Cuss Hill; on which is located "U.S.M.M. No 2;" Tombstone District; Cochise County; Arizona Territory, and is about one and one half miles south of the City of Tombstone.

Improvements.

On this claim are five shafts, some of which have crosscuts and drifts; One Tunnel; One House; One Barn; One Blacksmith Shop; One Hoisting Whim; and upwards of fifteen hundred feet of wagon Road, - all of which were made by the applicants or their grantors.

Shaft 1 - is 200 feet deep, and at bottom has Drift - east 20ft. - west 30ft. and crosscut - north 40ft.

Shaft 2 - is 50 ft deep, and has crosscut - north 28 feet at the bottom.

Shaft 3 - is 4x6 ft. and 15 ft deep

Shaft 4 - is 4x6 ft. and 20 ft deep.

Shaft 5 - is 330 ft deep. has hoisting whim over it on the surface. and has several crossovers at different levels

The Tunnel is run westerly upon the Ledge a distance of 37 feet.

The House is a frame building 10x20 ft.

The Barn is a frame building 8x10 ft.

The Blacksmith shop is a frame building 8x10 ft.

The Whim, is an ordinary drum, with two horse power, and capacity of hoisting 400 feet.

The Road has been constructed for the use and purpose of the Mines, about 1500 feet being upon the Prompter Mine, and constructed by its owners.

Shafts marked upon the plat - a; b; c; d, and the cut were not made by the Prompter G. & S. M. Co. or their grantors.

Shaft a, is 4x6 ft. and 24 ft. deep

Shaft b, is 3x5 ft. and 3 feet deep

Shaft c, is 4x6 ft. and 9 feet deep

Shaft d, is 4x6 ft. and 10 feet deep.

The cut is 4x6x4 feet.

Remarks. -

The Prompter Applicants waive all claims to those parts of the Sunset, and Extacy Mining Claims, which conflict with the Prompter ground, as shown upon the Plat, and will exclude the same from their application for U.S. Patent.

The conflict of "two tenths of an acre" (1/10) existing between the Knoxville M. Co. and this claim, is claimed by the "Prompter Applicants" and the Agent of the owners

of the "Knoxville M.C." was present when my survey was made, and expressed himself to me, as waiving all claims to that part in conflict, as shown by the plat. I have therefore not deducted it from the total area of the Prompter M.C., either in my notes, or plat.

In the case of the Prompter G. & S. M. Co., against the owners of the Mountain Top mine, held in the Second Judicial District Territory of Arizona, ^{County of Cochise} City of Tombstone; tried in the month of March A.D. 1883, before Judge Phinney, to settle the title to the ground in conflict between the Prompter and Mountain Top mines. It was decided, that the legal title belonged to the Prompter G. & S. M. Co., and the said decision is now of Record in the office of the District-Clerk of said District. In consequence of this decision, there is no conflict; on part of the "Mt Top M.C." to note in this Survey, although the broken red lines on the plat, show the locus of the "Mt Top" lines originally.

The Township Lines being about two miles, East, or North, and the surface very hilly, it is impossible to connect this Survey, with a Section, or Township, Corner of the Public Survey with accuracy.

This Survey corresponds with the monuments on the ground, but differs slightly in Bearings, and distances, ^{from Amended Location Notice} owing to the effects of Local attraction on the needles of different Instruments, while the measurements of this Survey were made with a steel tape, and must be correct, and I am informed the preliminary measurements were made with a chain.

All corners were connected with bearing points, where practicable.

I hereby certify, that the Improvements made upon this Claim by the Applicants, or their grantors, exceed in value the amount of Five hundred (\$500) Dollars

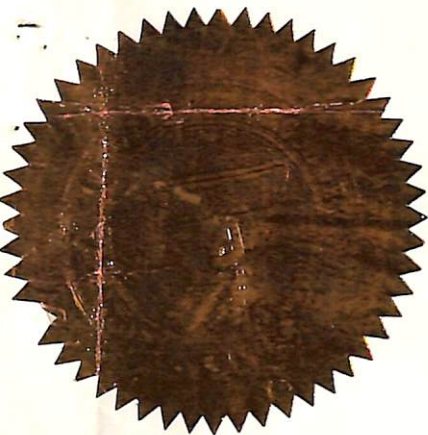

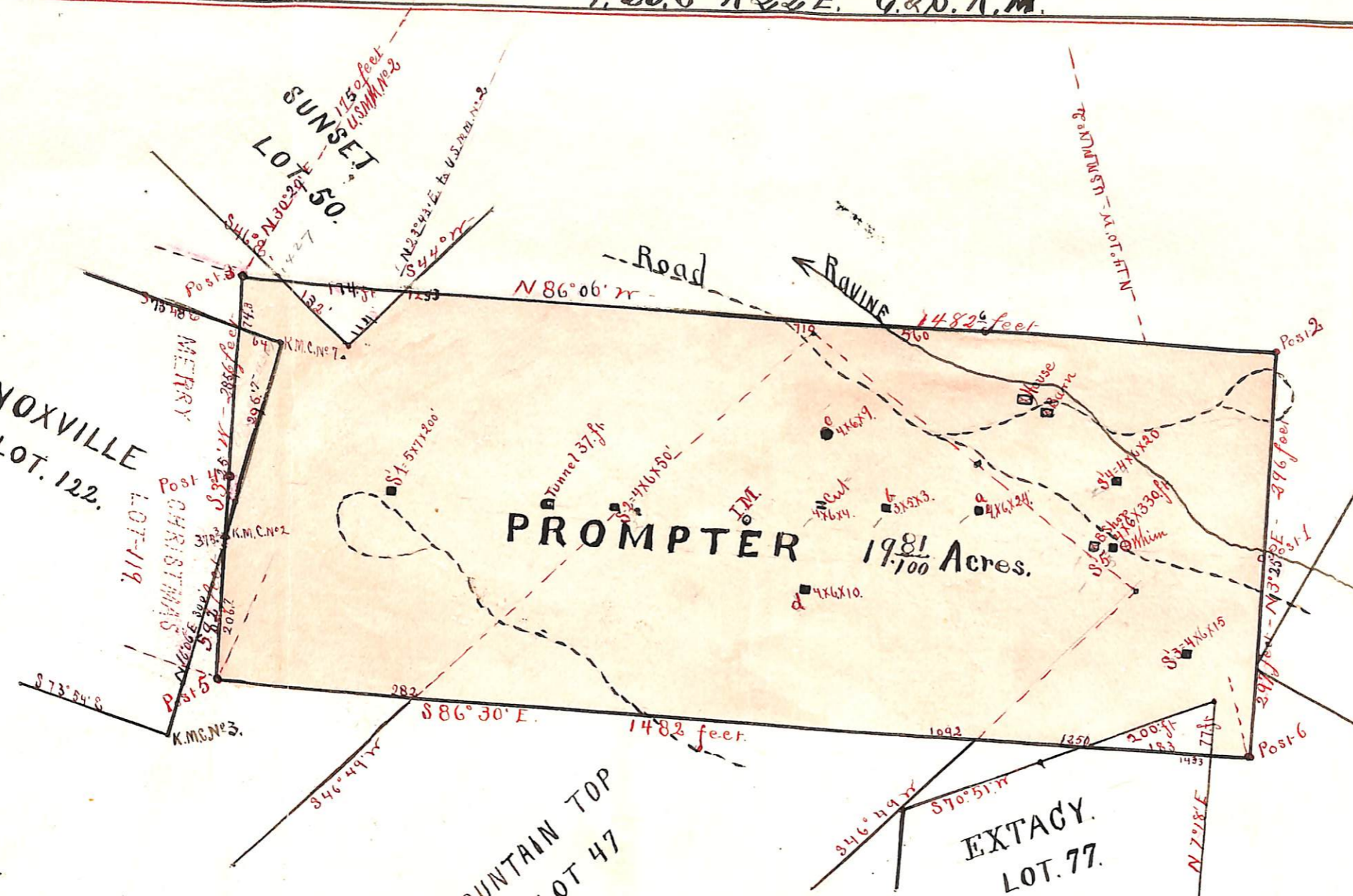


