Having first compared my "Transit" with the Standard Meridian established in Tombstone District, Jan 19-1881, under instructions from U.S. Surveyor General, - I find the variation of the Needle to be: $11^{\circ} 53'$ East

I begin at center monument on east end of Claim, where I set a post 4 in square and 5 ft long marked H. M. C. No 1 - 12 feet in the ground, and surrounded by mount of rocks $3 \times 3 \times 3$. The same being on croppings of Sedge.

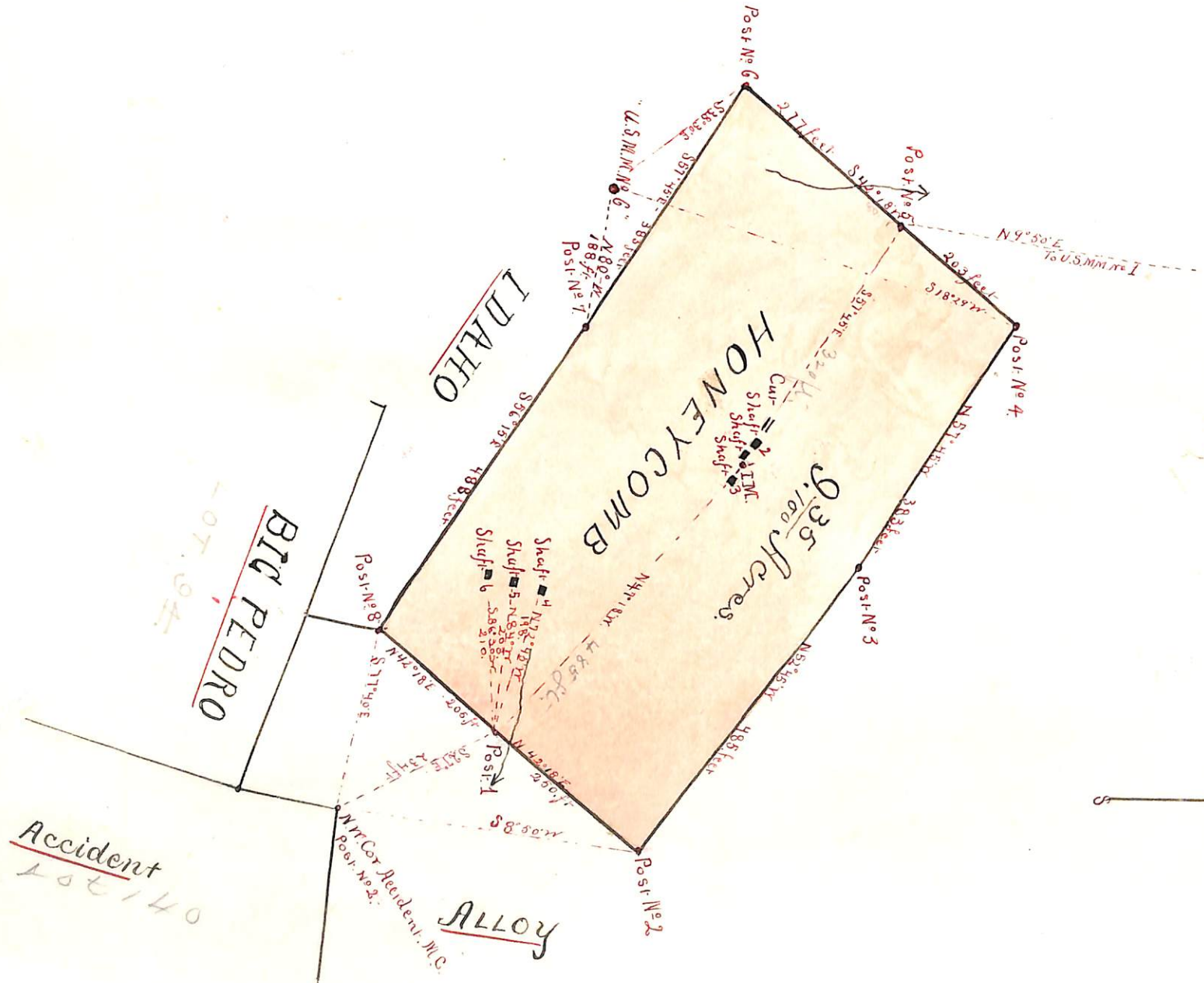
