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The original owners of this mine, when it was known as the Cerro Colorado, were W. S. Colt, the founder of the Colt's Firearms Co., and Posten, the 1st Delegate to Congress from Arizona, (1863) who worked the property in 1860-61, taking out over \$6,000,000 worth of silver, shipping same to Wales via Gulf of California. Soliders were stationed on the property to protect it from the Indians, and the ruins of their barracks are noted on the plat of this survey.

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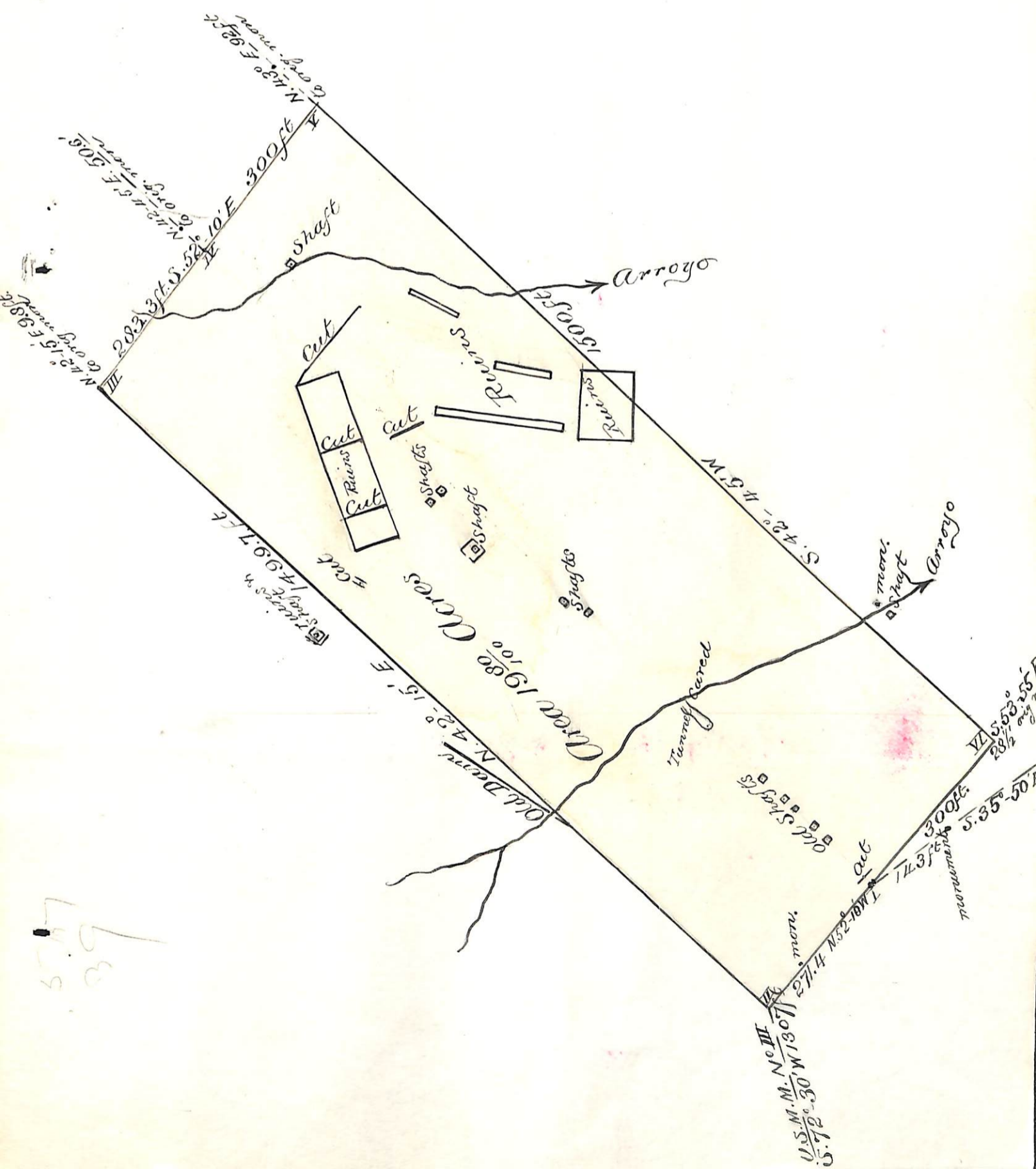
