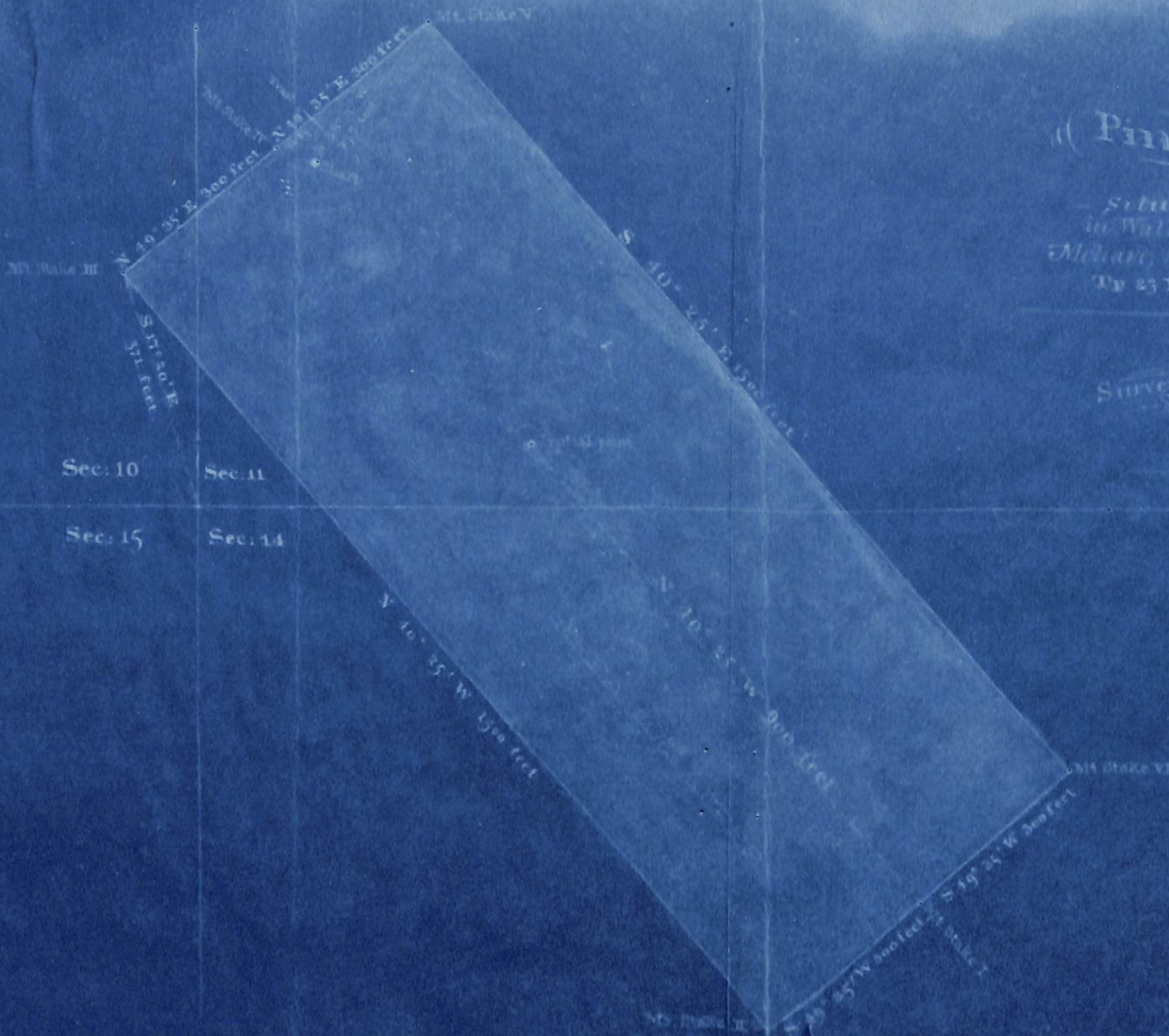

I determined the true meridian
by equal shadows of the sun, making

summer solstice, June 21st 1883,
and obtained fourteen (14) degrees
and twenty five (25) minutes east
as the variation

The survey and the location described
in the certified copy of record of lo-
cation are identical.

The posts two (2) by four (4) inches
projected by mounds of stone -
have been set in the ground at
nearly one and one half (1 1/2) feet
as the proximity of the bed rock
to the surface of the ground would
allow

Improvements consist of a shaft

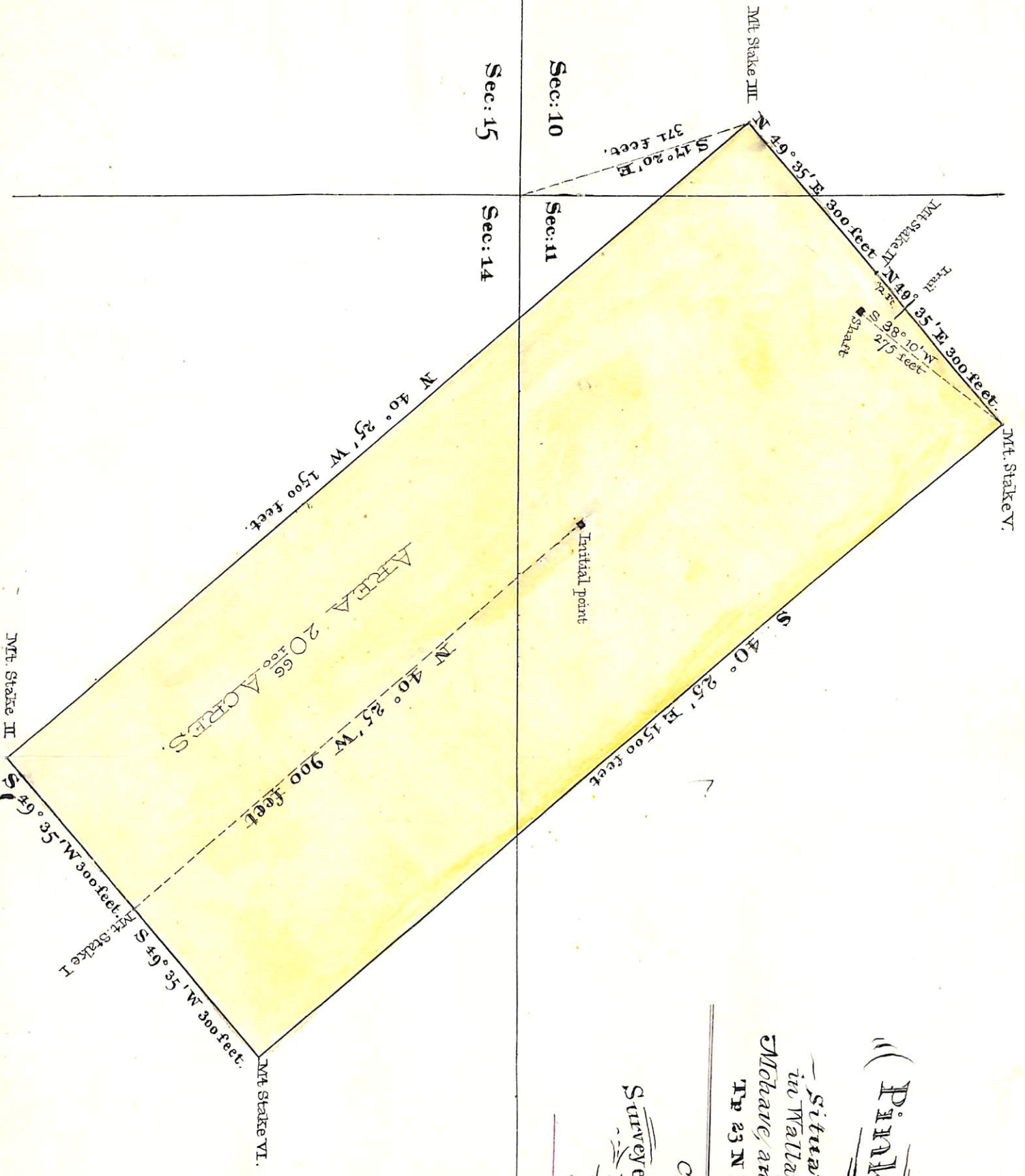
