# Official Survey of the Pinkham Mine

Claimed by Henry D. Wilson, Situate  
in Gold Butte Mining District, County of  
Mohave, Territory of Arizona.

The Survey has been executed  
with a Heller and Brightly Transit  
(Philadelphia made)

I determined the true meridian  
byurnal shadows of the sun, making  
my observations at the time of the  
Summer Solstice, June 21<sup>st</sup> 1883,  
and obtained fourteen (14) degrees  
and twenty five (25) minutes east  
as the variation.

The Survey and the location described  
in the certified copy of record of lo-  
cation are identical.

The posts two (2) by four (4) inches  
protected by mounds of stone -  
have been set in the ground as  
nearly one and one half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) feet  
as the proximity of the bed rock  
to the surface of the ground would  
allow.

Improvements consist of a shaft  
seventy four (74) feet deep from  
bottom of which a cross cut has  
been run a distance of seven (7)  
feet. Also one shot about ten  $\frac{1}{10}$   
feet deep.

The value of labor and improvements  
placed up on the Pinkham mine
