Personally appeared before me, Edward H. Wilton a United States Deputy Surveyor of Mineral Lands for the District of Arizona, who being duly sworn deposes and says - that - under instructions from the United States Surveyor General for the District of Arizona dated Tucson A. T. 11<sup>th</sup> June A. D. 1883 he made a Survey of the Leucathan mine, (or Patens) situated in the Warner Mining District, Yavapai County Territory of Arizona, and owned & claimed by Charles P. Stanton and that he is satisfied that "five hundred dollars (\$500<sup>00</sup>) worth of work has been done on said mine - and that the assessment work since its relocation on the 4<sup>th</sup> January 1877 amounts to over five hundred dollars.
