Field Notes.

On the night of the 9th
 of Feb. 1884., I took the Western
 Elongation of the North Star,
 by which I make the Variation
 at this place to be
 $12^{\circ} 5' E$

The instrument used by me
 in this work was a Transit and
 the courses were taken "Magnetic"
 and reduced to the True Meridian.
 The readings were taken at
 both ends of each line and
 were found to correspond.

Field Notes of the Survey of the Rucker Mining Claim

The Rucker Mining claim was located in Aug 1877; and in the months of Sept or October 1880, was surveyed by Chas. Ackley at which time small posts (2×4) were placed in the monuments.

The survey followed the original location, and the amended location notice was based upon the survey. This was followed by me as closely as possible.




