INSTRUMENT.

This amended survey was made with Berger & Sons Transit No. 5067 in good adjustment. Distances were measured with 500 ft. and 50 ft. steel tapes. All bearings were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observations on Polaris, checked by solar observations both direct and with Bergers patent solar adapter.

LOCATION.

This survey is located in Eureka Mining District, Yavapai County, Arizona, on unsurveyed ground, in about T. 14 N., R. 9 W., G. & S. R. B. & M. Latitude 34° 38' N.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.

Adjoining claims are Mint Annex, Hawkeye Annex, Trapezoid and Copper Filling, all unsurveyed and all owned by claimant company, which adjoin this survey on the N.W., E., S.W., & W., respectively; also the Natural Point, Sur. 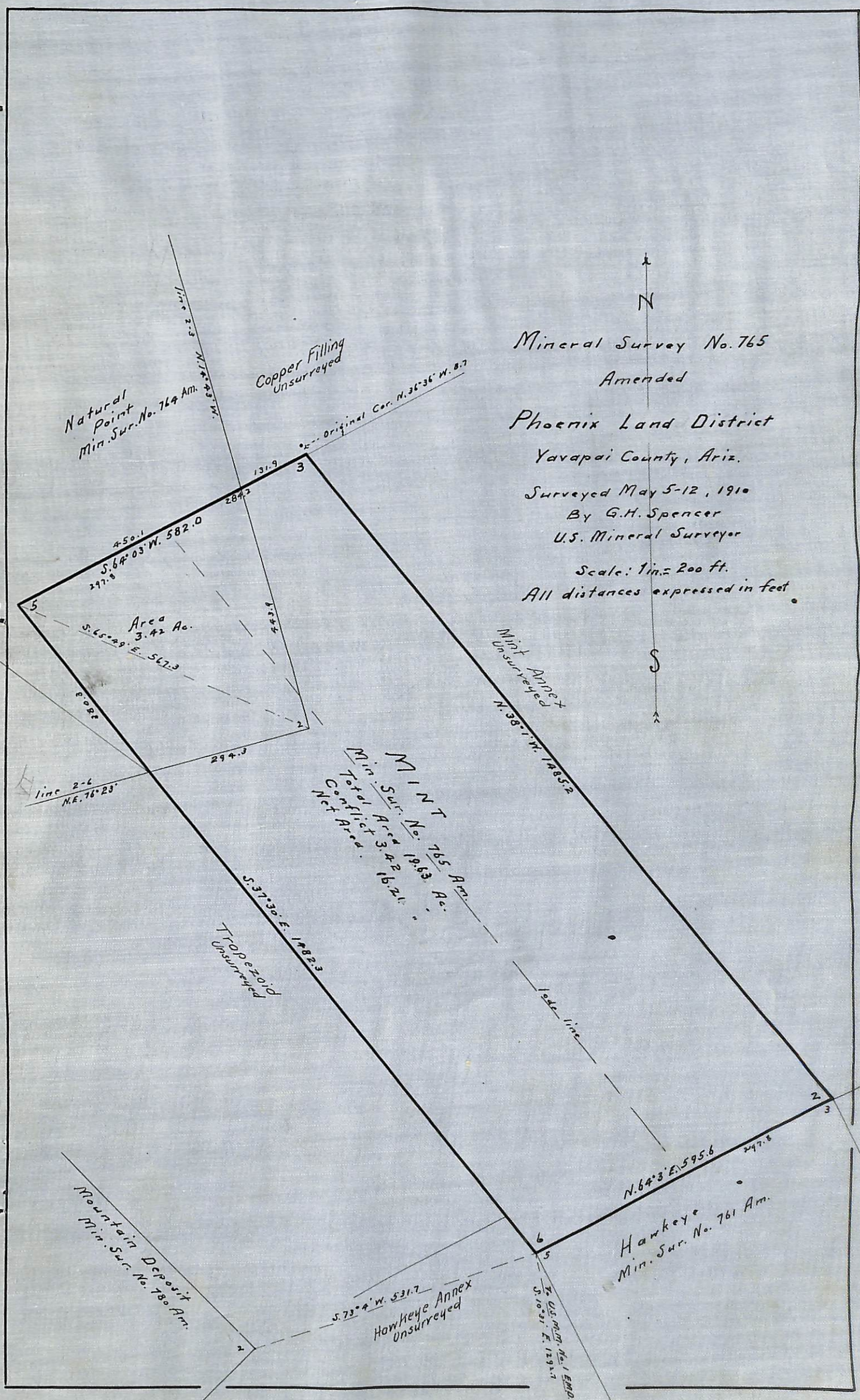
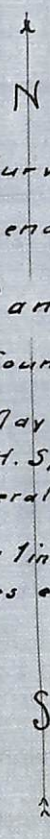
