Tombstone Mining District

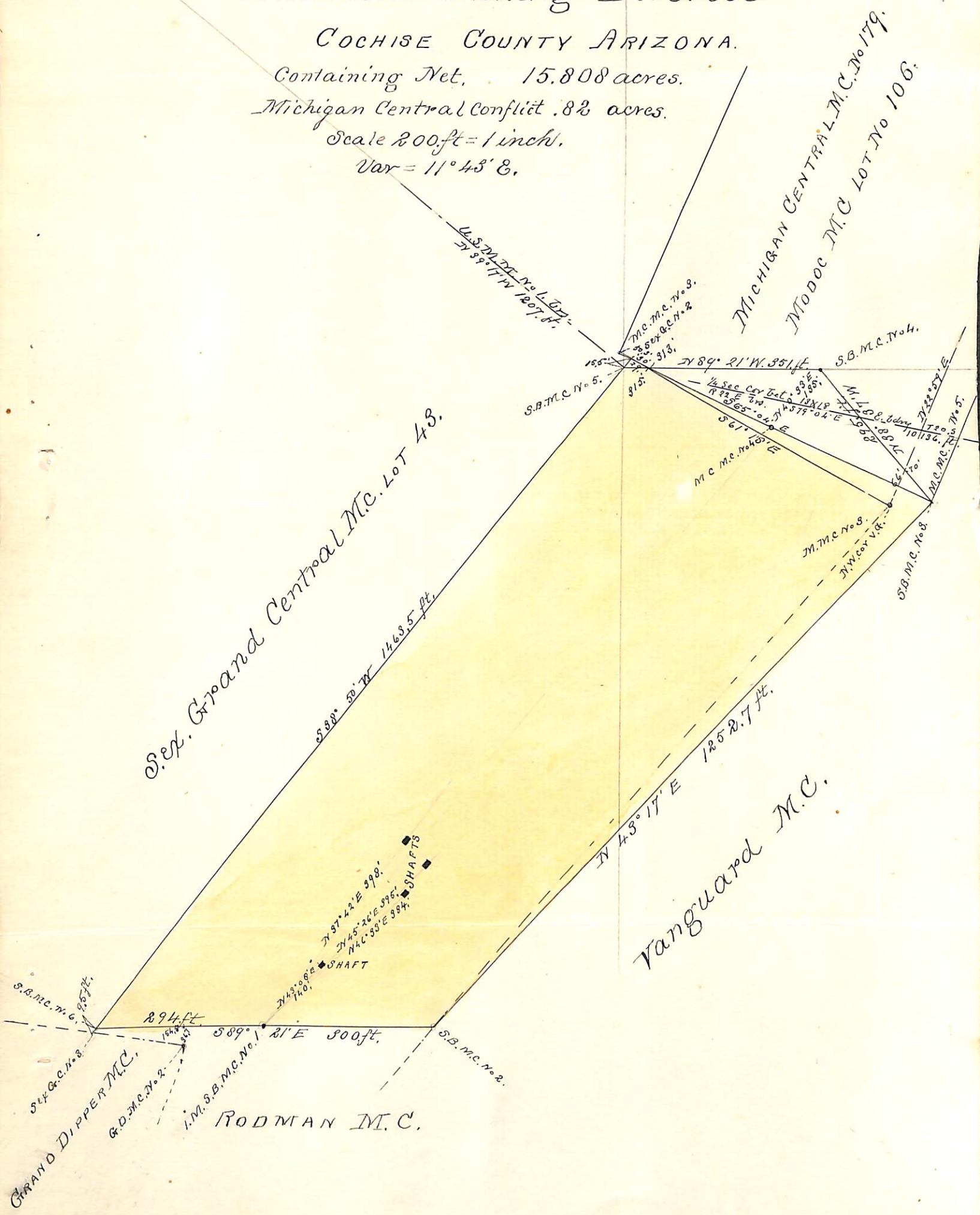
COCHISE COUNTY ARIZONA.
