STATE OF IOWA MINING CLAIM

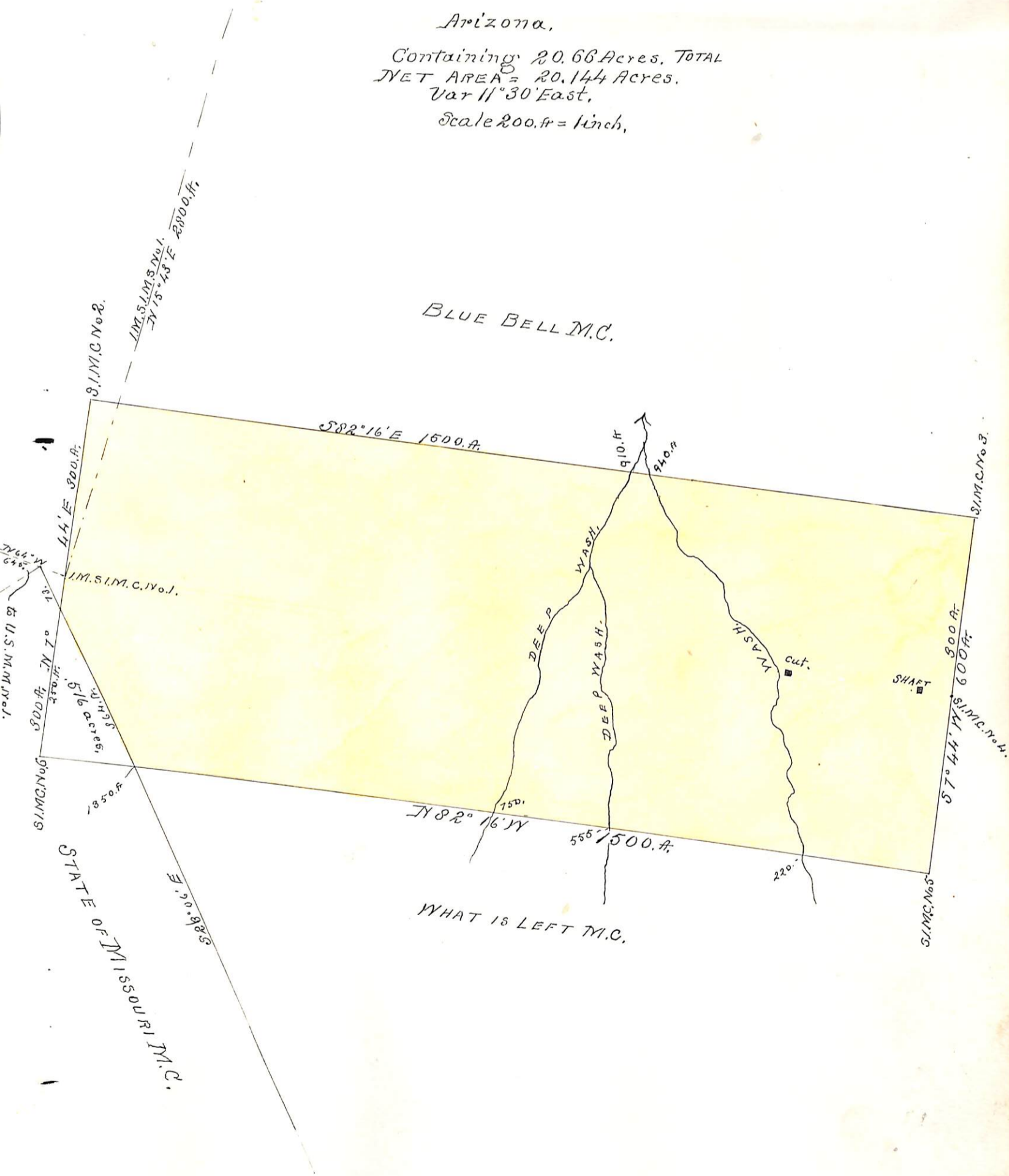
