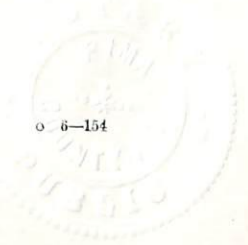

the Greenlee Gold Mountain Mining District

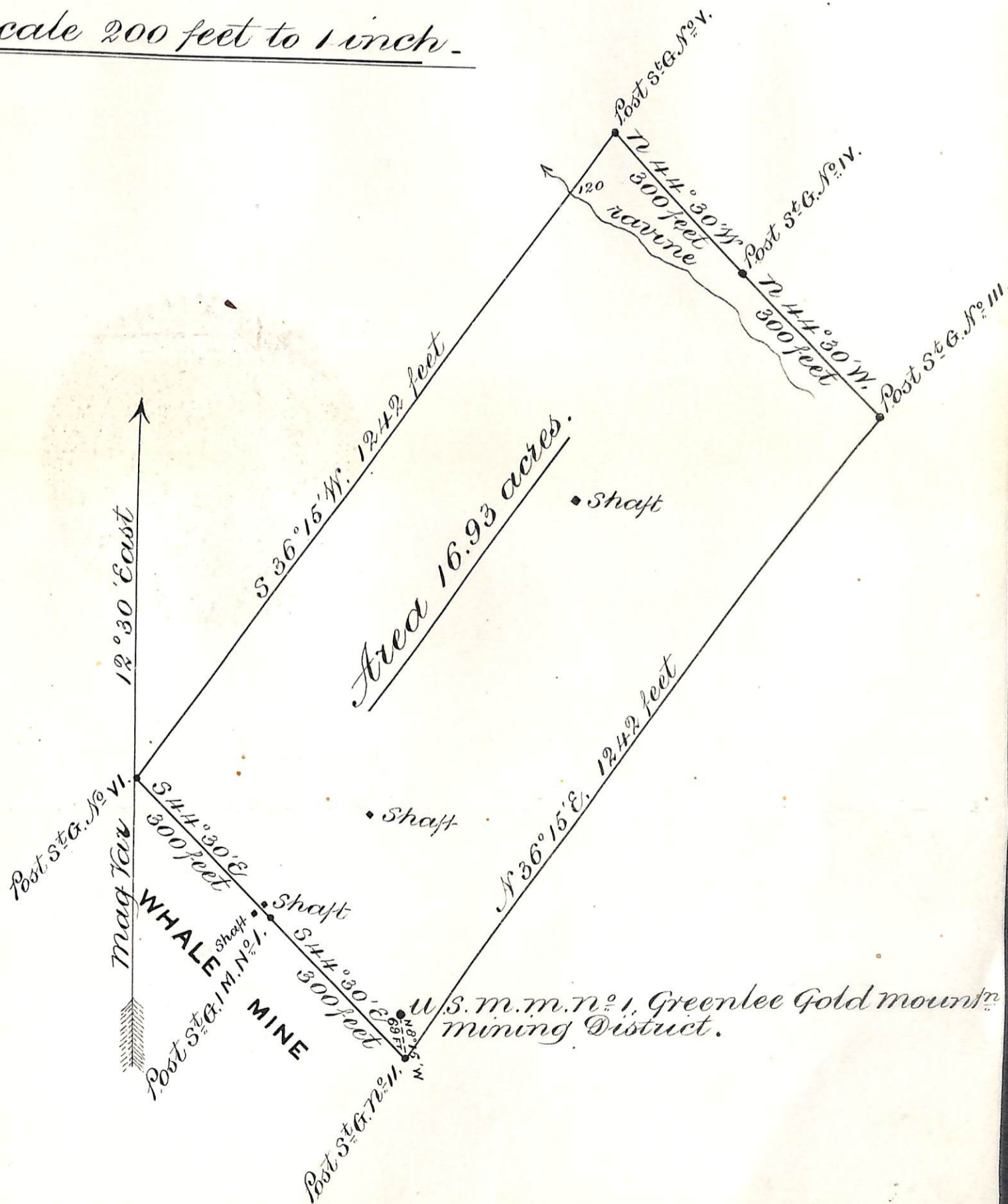
