of the

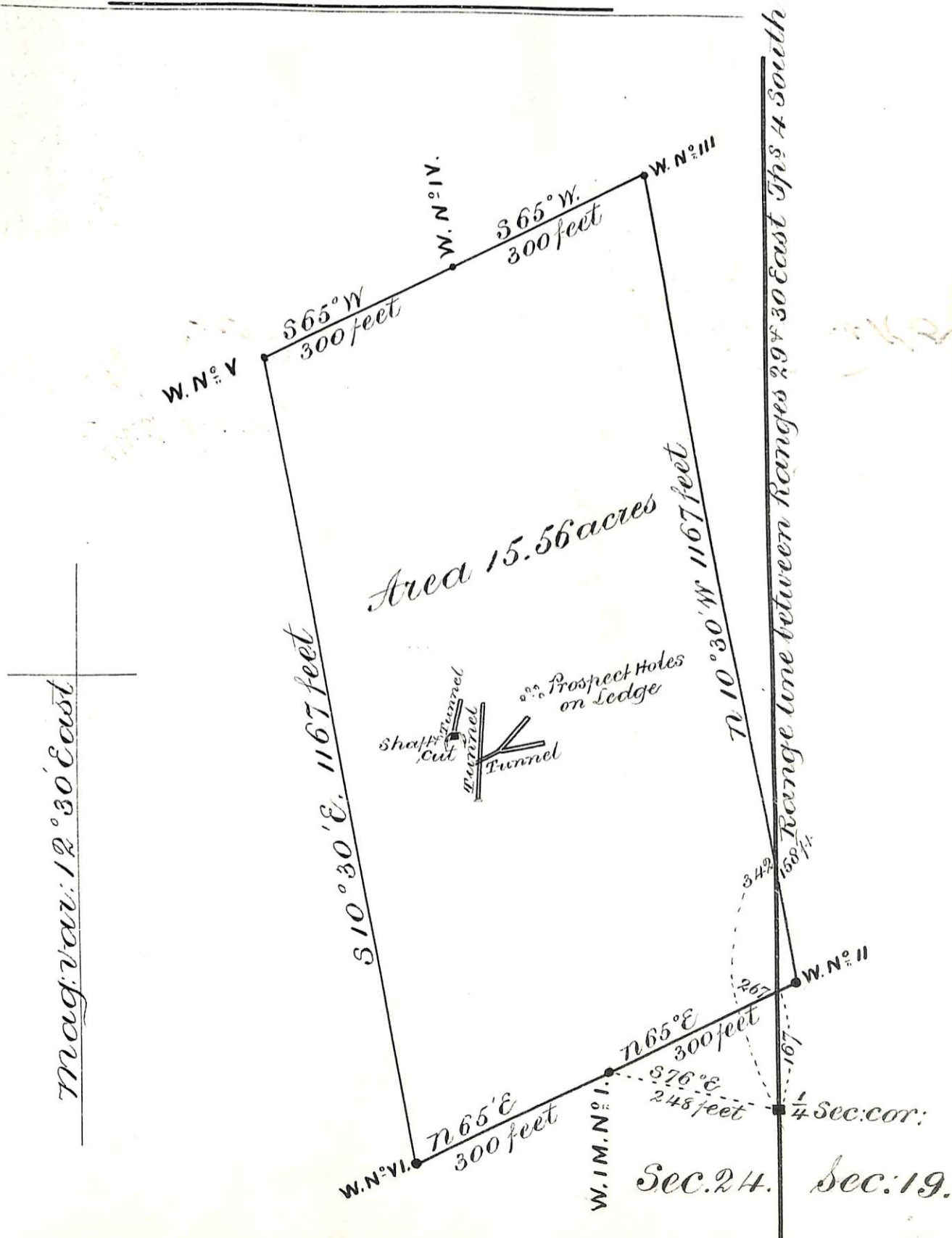
