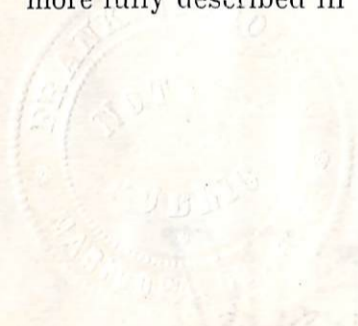

Made upon this claim by claimant consists of discovery shaft 5 ft. x 8 ft. and 9 ft. deep, N. 73° 2' E. 60 ft. from Post E. No. 4.

The claimant has made application for survey prior to making application for patent for 33 claims upon which claimant, for their general development,

has erected a 50-ton copper smelting plant with office, boarding house and engineer's cottage at an aggregate cost of \$25,000.00 and has constructed a 3-inch standard wrought iron pipe line, 7 1/2 miles long, to convey water from the Haicuwai Mountains to said smelting works at a cost of \$32,000.00.

These smelting works were built for the purpose of treating the ore from this and 32 other claims belonging to claimant.

And I hereby certify that the value of improvements on this claim exceeds the sum of five hundred dollars.

No improvements have been made by other parties on this claim.

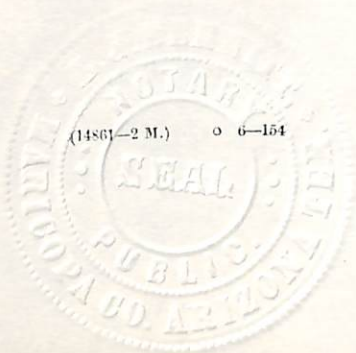

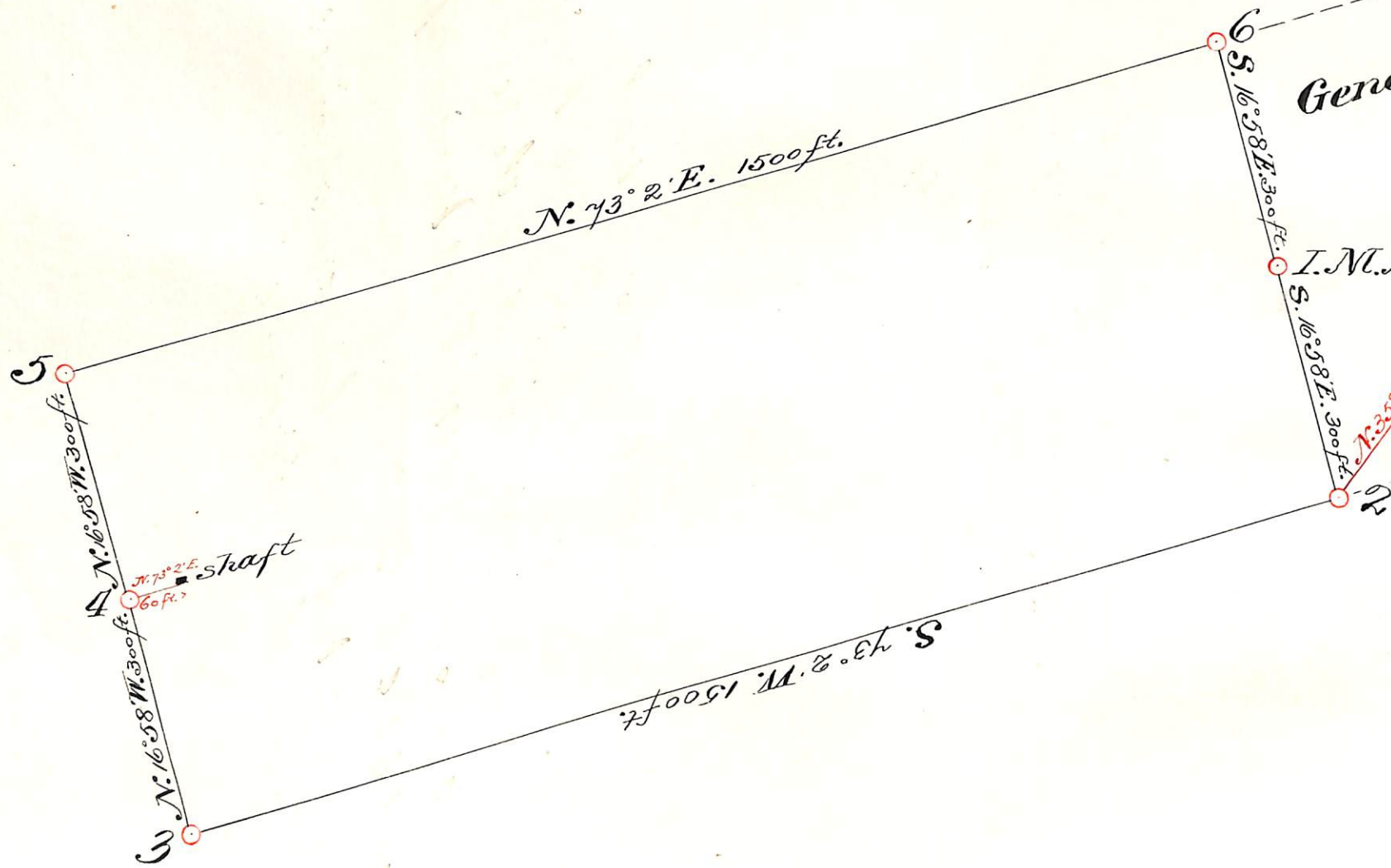
