Location.

This claim is located in the Warren Mining District, Cochise County, Arizona Territory, about 1 1/4 miles, south west of the Copper Queen Con. Mining Co's Smelter at Bisbee, and is bounded upon the South by the Disowned Mine M.C., lot no 39. This claim was officially surveyed in 1881, and designated as lot No 42. No Application for Patent was then made.

Improvements.

Made upon this claim by claimant or his grantors, consist of a Shaft, 4 x 7 ft., 15 ft. deep, with incline drift at bottom 1 x 5 ft., 15 ft. long, N 74° 35' W 40 ft., and a Shaft, 4 x 6 ft., 10 ft. deep; N 54° 15' W 75 ft., and a Shaft, 4 x 6 ft., 10 ft. deep N 7° W 150 ft., and a Shaft, 4 x 6 ft., 10 ft. deep, N 21° 30' W 275 ft., and a Shaft, 4 x 6 ft., 10 ft. deep, N 20° 0' W 325 ft., from Post A.M. No. 3.

A Shaft, 4 x 6 ft., 8 ft. deep N 16° E 60 ft., from Post A.M. No. 4.

A Tunnel (or cut), 5 ft wide 6 ft high 12 ft. long bears S 3° 30' W 200 ft., from Post I.M.A.M. No. 1.

And I hereby certify that the value of said improvements exceeds the sum of five hundred dollars.

There have been no improvements made by other parties on this claim.

Instruments used a Young & Sons improved Solar Transit and steel tape.

Bar and courses taken by use of the Solar Apparatus, checked by triangulation to other official surveys.

Note

I find that the 4x4 in Posts set around this claim were not marked, pieces of thin shak were marked with Paint and tacked to them, most of which have either been pulled or fallen off.

The Posts set by me around this claim have the letters cut in with a V. marking iron,

I connect this claim with U.S. M.M. No 4, as U.S. M.M. No 2 was washed away by flood in 1890.

I find the end lines of this claim to bear $N 78^{\circ} 52' W$ and $S 78^{\circ} 52' E$ while the Survey of 1881 gives these lines at $N 77^{\circ} 05' W$ and $S 77^{\circ} 05' E$.

I find the side lines to be $S 15^{\circ} 55' W$ and $N 15^{\circ} 55' W$ while the survey of 1881, gives these lines at $S 17^{\circ} 45' W$ and $N 17^{\circ} 45' E$.

I can account for these discrepancies in this way, that the transit was not in adjustment and was not a Solar Transit.

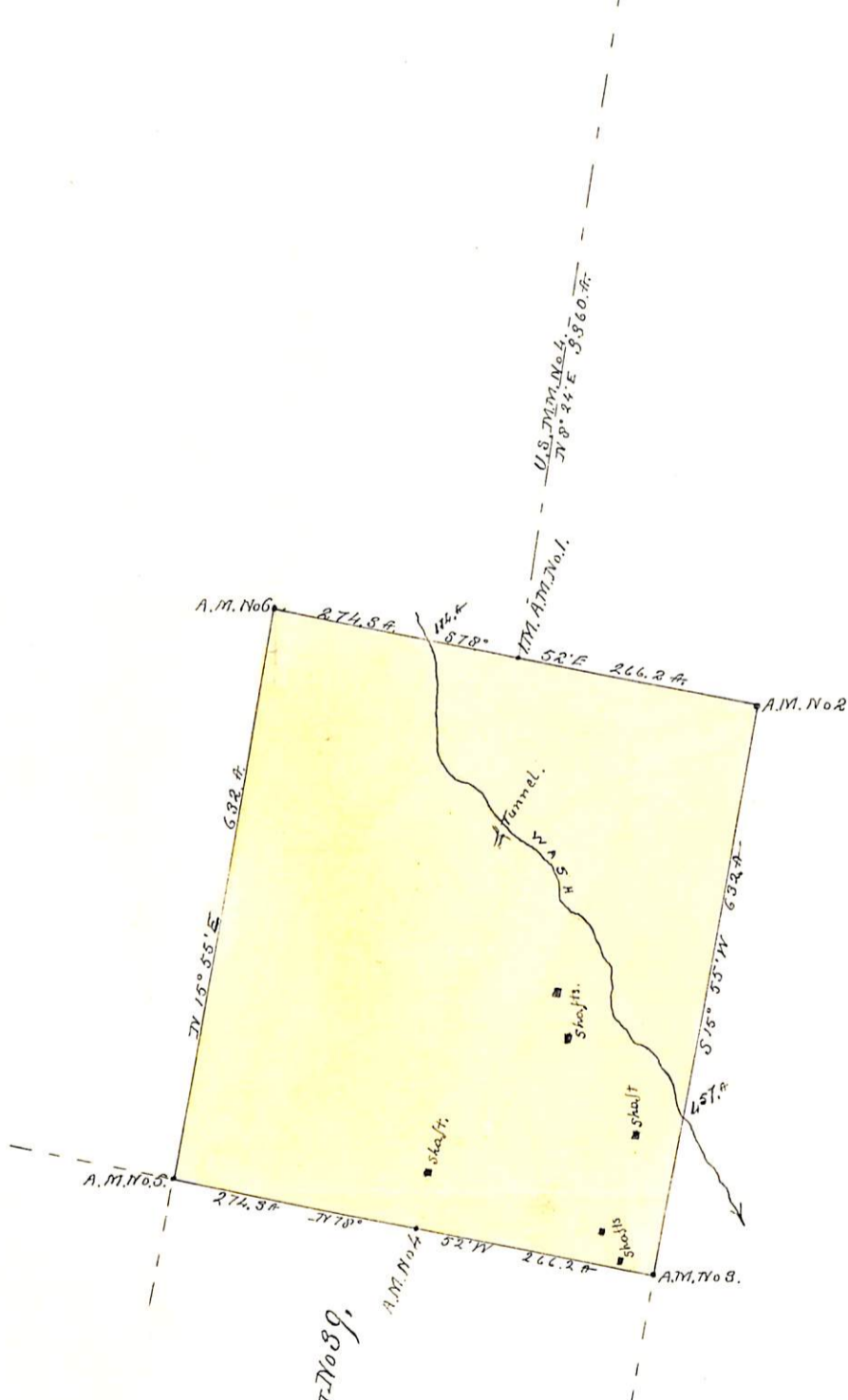
