### Instrument

The survey was made with a Buff & Berger transit No 1482 in vertical and horizontal adjustment

The true meridian was determined by an observation on Polaris at 7.30 P.M. mean solar time Sept 20<sup>th</sup> 1894 when at its eastern elongation, by setting the transit over Cor. No. 1 and setting a tack point about 50 yds distant in line with the star. From this course I deflected  $1^{\circ}33'$  to the left for the true meridian, being the azimuth angle for Latitude  $35^{\circ}$  north, and from the true meridian all other courses are deflected

The distances were measured with a 50 ft steel tape.
