Know all men by these presents;--

That we the undersigned have this day located 1500 feet of this vein or lode bearing precious metals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, with surface ground 300 feet on each side of vein, with all Mineral Deposits contained therein, and all Timber and Water thereon, or appurtenant thereto, under and according to the provisions of the United States Mining Laws.

The Exterior boundaries are as follows;--

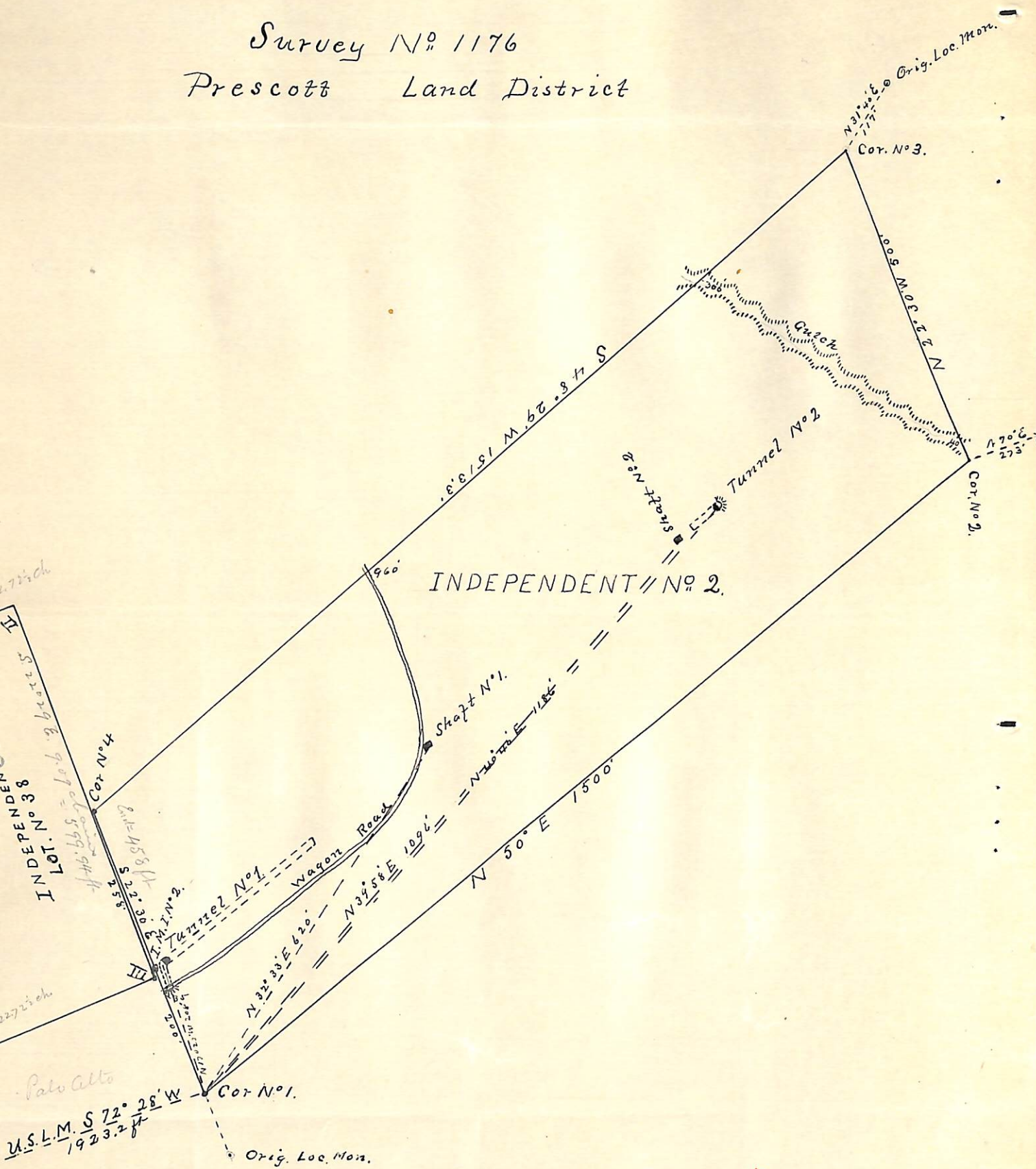
