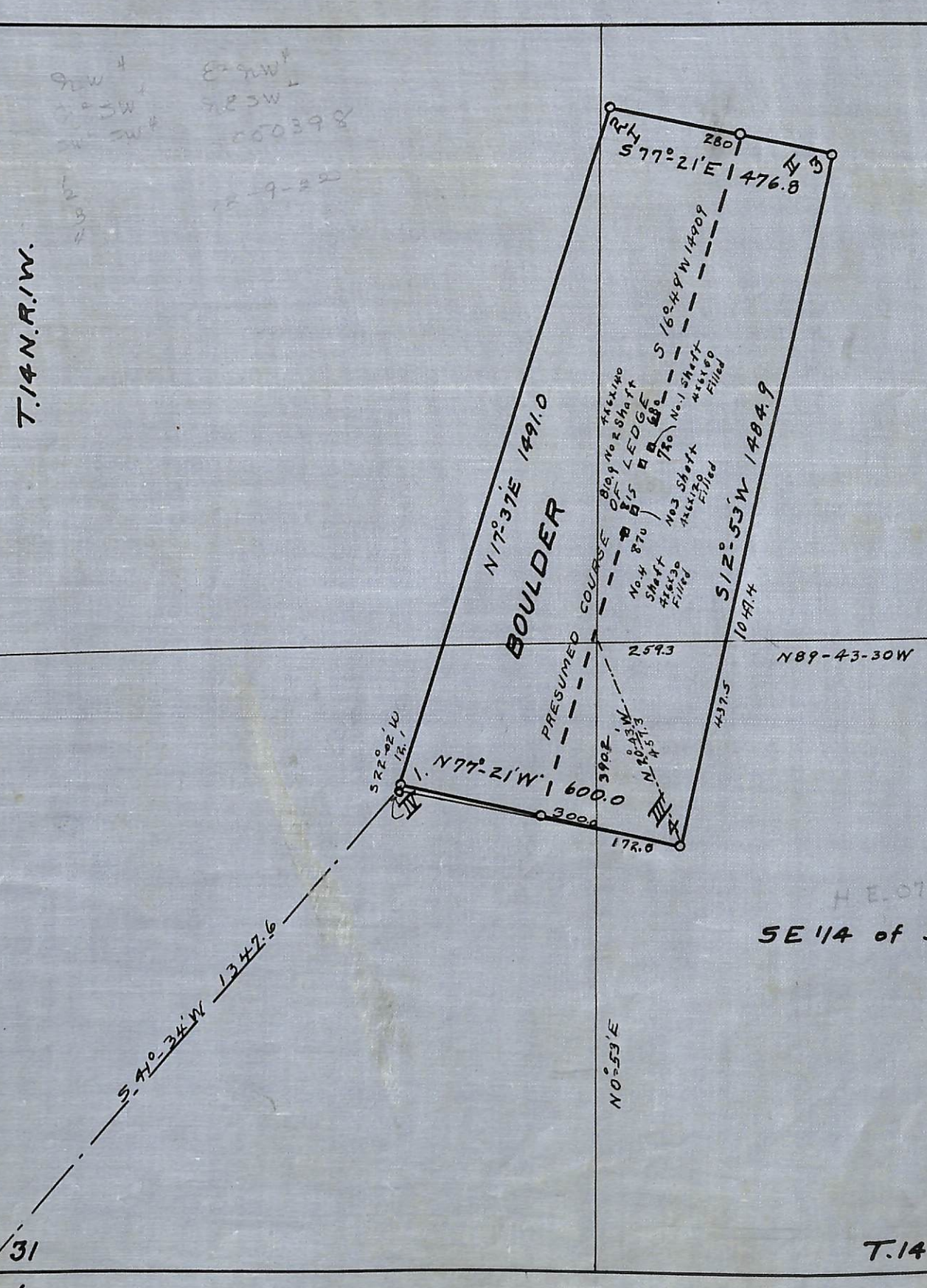
KEY MAP SHOWING METHOD OF SUB-DIVIDING SEC 31

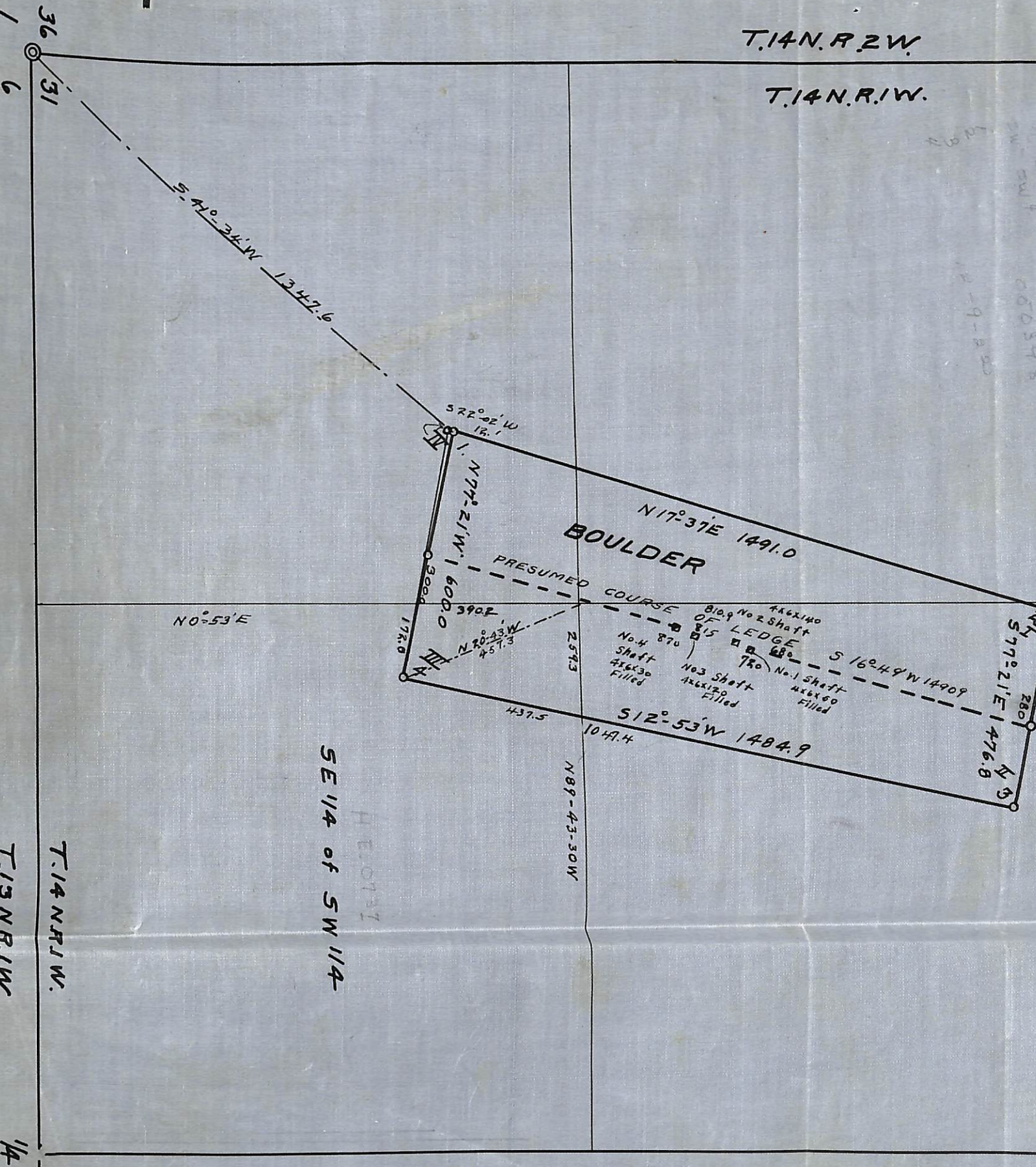

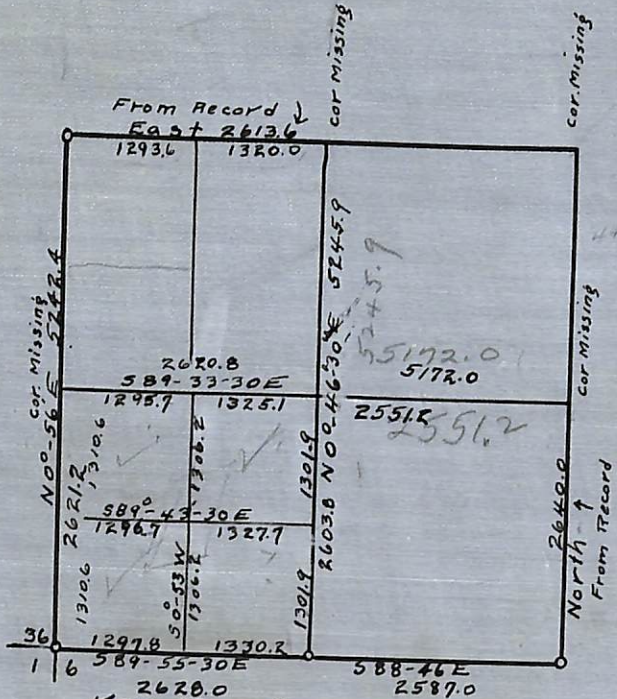

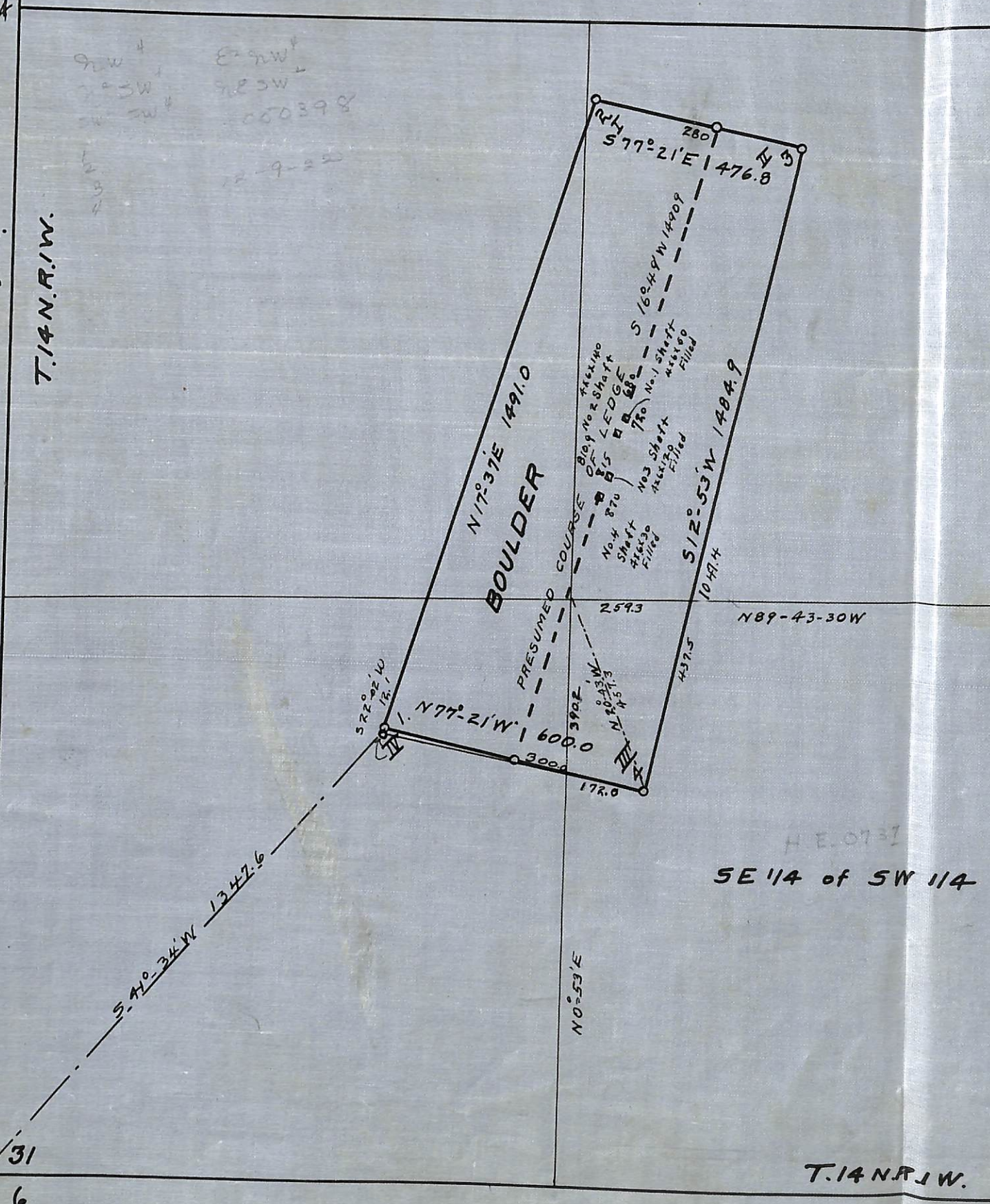
