There being no corner of the public survey or U.S. location mon., within two miles of the Mammoth or American beds, survey No's 1200 & 1199. I established a U.S. L.M. on a prominent point, visible for a long distance in every direction and so located as to be permanent.

I located it on the 20th day of April 1896, about 1 1/2 miles in an easterly direction from the smelter on Castle Creek, which place is known as Briggs P.O.

I chiseled a + for center point, and U.S. L.M. No. 1, C.C.D on a solid granite ledge, which stands 20 ins above ground by 9 feet wide and 10 feet long, along side of which I built a mon. of stones 6 feet in diameter on base and 5 feet high. To the east about 1500 feet at foot of hill is Copperopolis Gulch, course South, on the N.W. at foot of hill is American gulch about 1000 feet. Silver Mt. bears N 60° E about 8 miles. Sheep Mt. bears S 57° E about 6 miles. Hot Springs on Castle Creek bears about S 10° W, 12 miles.

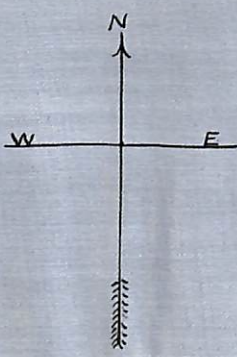

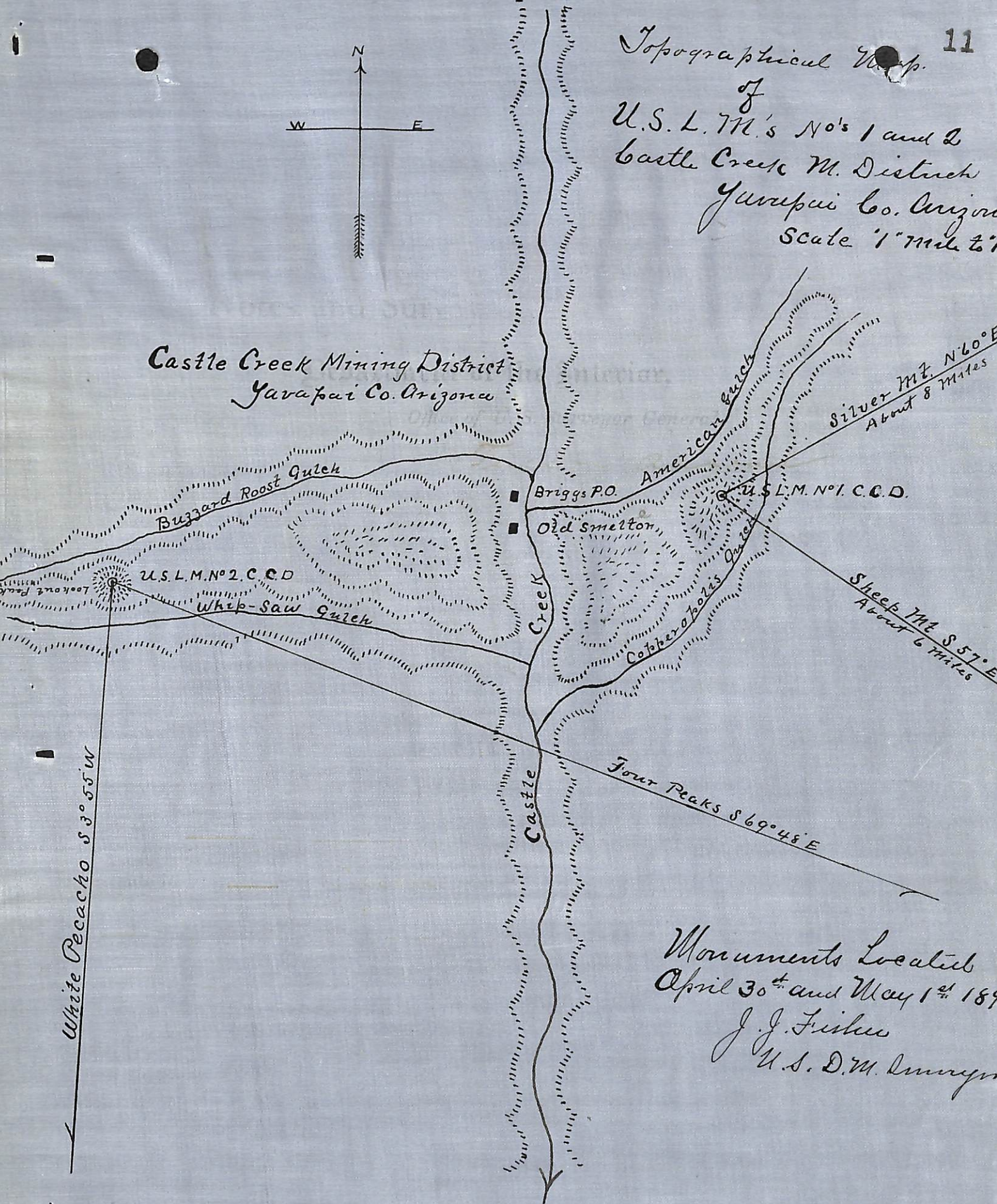
