1st North Extension of Silver Belt Mine.

The undersigned hereby claim for mining purposes Fifteen Hundred feet in length & Six Hundred feet in width of the above ledge.

Commencing at this monument thence running in a North Westerly direction for three hundred feet to a monument, thence running in a North Easterly direction for Fifteen hundred feet to a monument, thence running in a South Easterly direction Six Hundred feet to a rock monument, thence running in a South Westerly direction for fifteen hundred feet to a monument, thence in a North Westerly direction for three hundred feet to a monument which is the place of beginning.

The above may be more generally described as being the first North East extension of the Silver Belt Mine and is situate about two and a half miles west of the Agua Fria mills and is in the Goodwin Mining District & shall be known as the Cabinet Silver Mine.

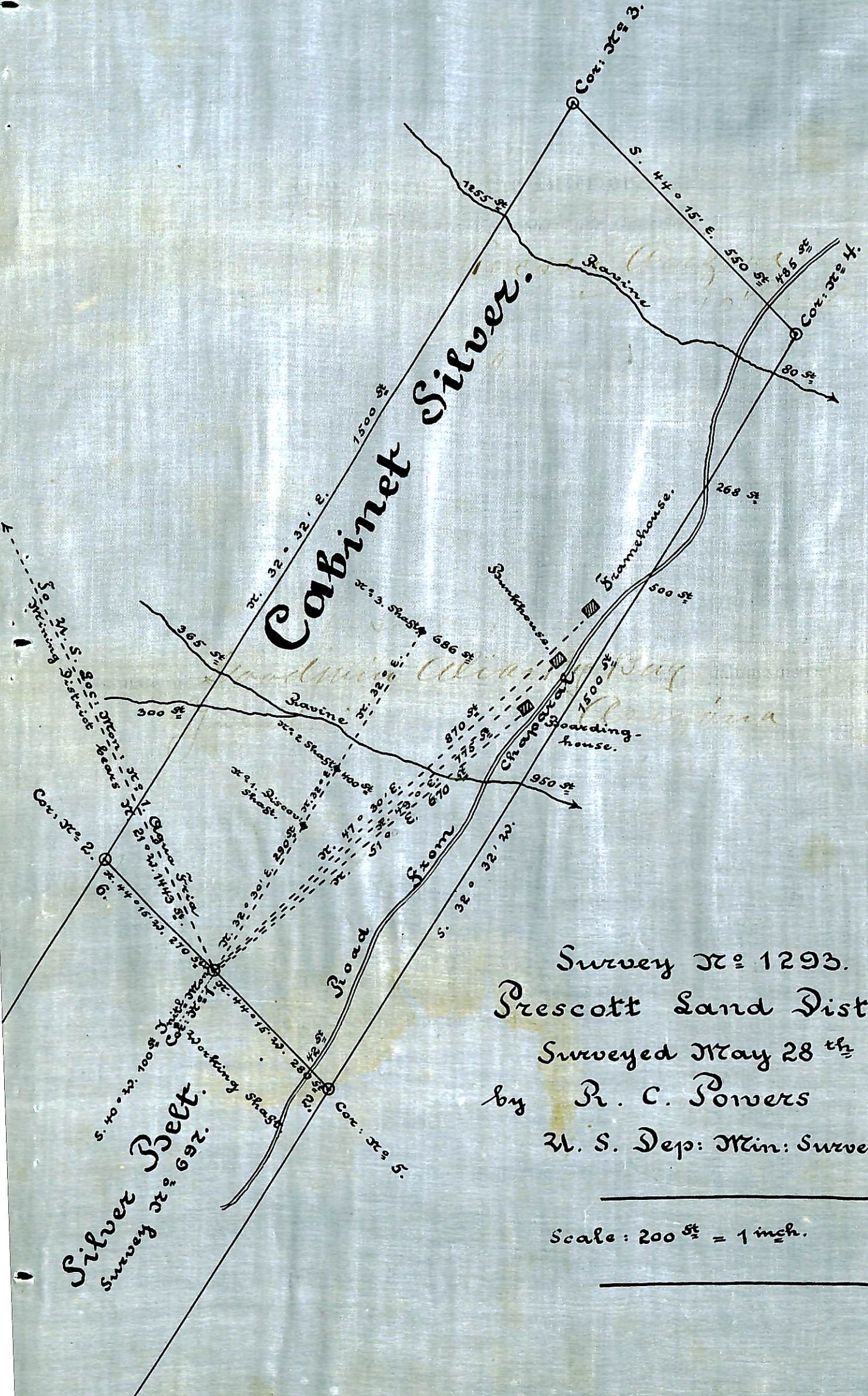
