## Survey No 1307

## U. S. L. Monument

Located July 11<sup>th</sup> 1898.

There being no U. S. L. M. or lev. of the public surveys within two miles of the Trilby Lode, Survey No 1307. I established a U. S. L. Monument, on a prominent hill visible for a long distance in all directions and so situated as not to be endangered by snow, rock or land slides, or other natural causes.

When I set a granite stone 12x12 inches 36 ins long, 18 ins in ground, on apex of which I chiseled a + for center point and on face of stone U. S. L. M. No 1307 A+ on a dyurite rock in place, marked B. R. U. S. L. M. No 1307 bearing S 85° 28' W 140 feet.

A + on a slate reef, marked U. S. L. M. No 1307 B. R. bearing S 7° 23' E 205 feet.

White Picacho Mt. bearing S 20° E about 2 miles. Costello Point bearing S 90° 40' E

Del Pases Mt. bearing N. 31° 30' E about 20 miles

Wades Peak bearing N. 10° 30' W about 10 miles

Castle Creek Hot Springs bearing about S 80° E 12 miles.

Hot Springs Junction on the P. & P. Santa Fe R. R. bearing about S 30° W 12 miles.

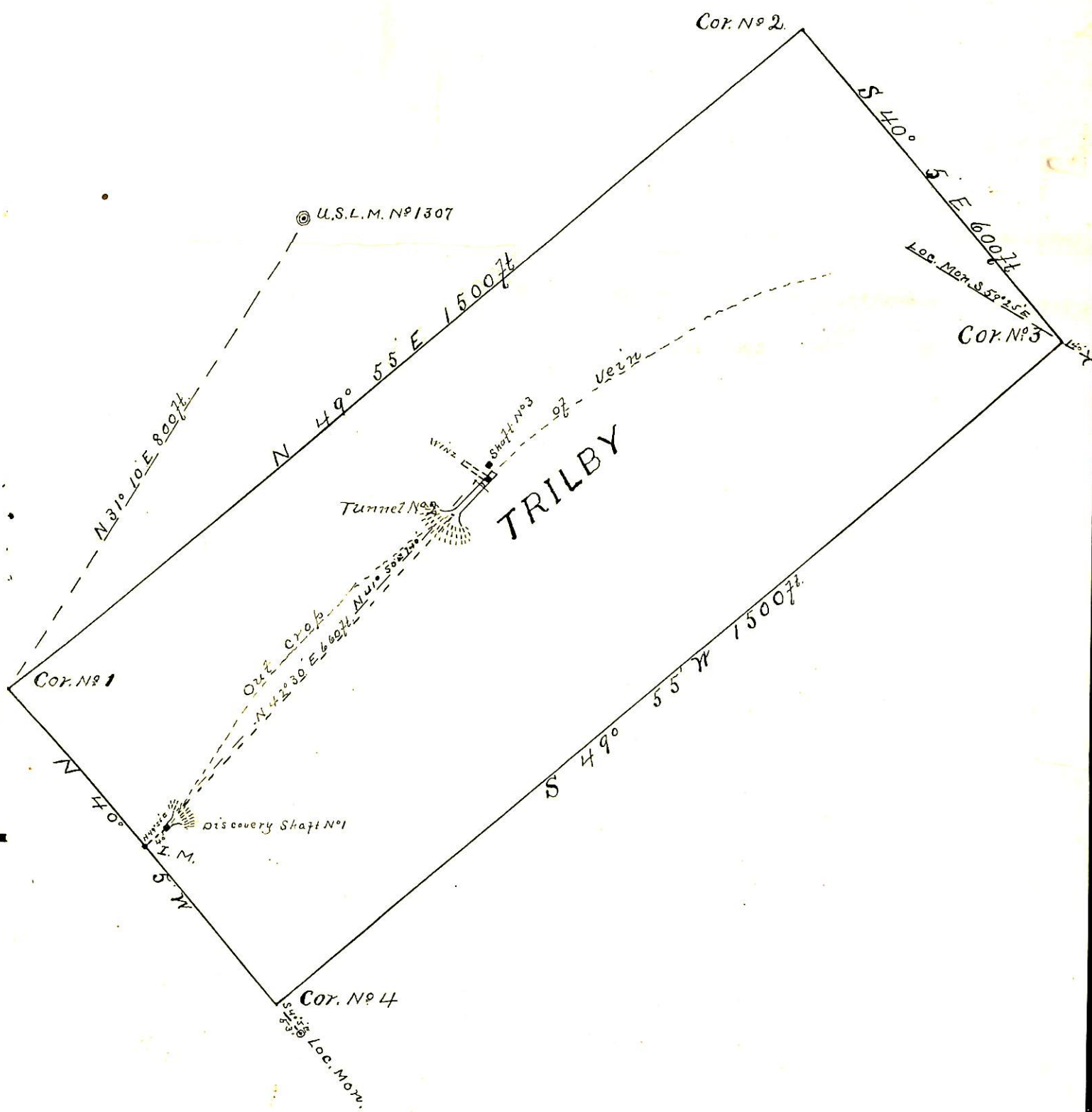
