L. Giroux, the undersigned on the 4th day of January 1899.

The length of this claim is Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet, and .. claim Seven Hundred & Fifty (750) feet in a Northeasterly direction and Seven Hundred & Fifty (750) feet in a Southwesterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with Three Hundred (300) feet in width of the surface ground, on each side of the center of said claim.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Southwest to the Northeast.

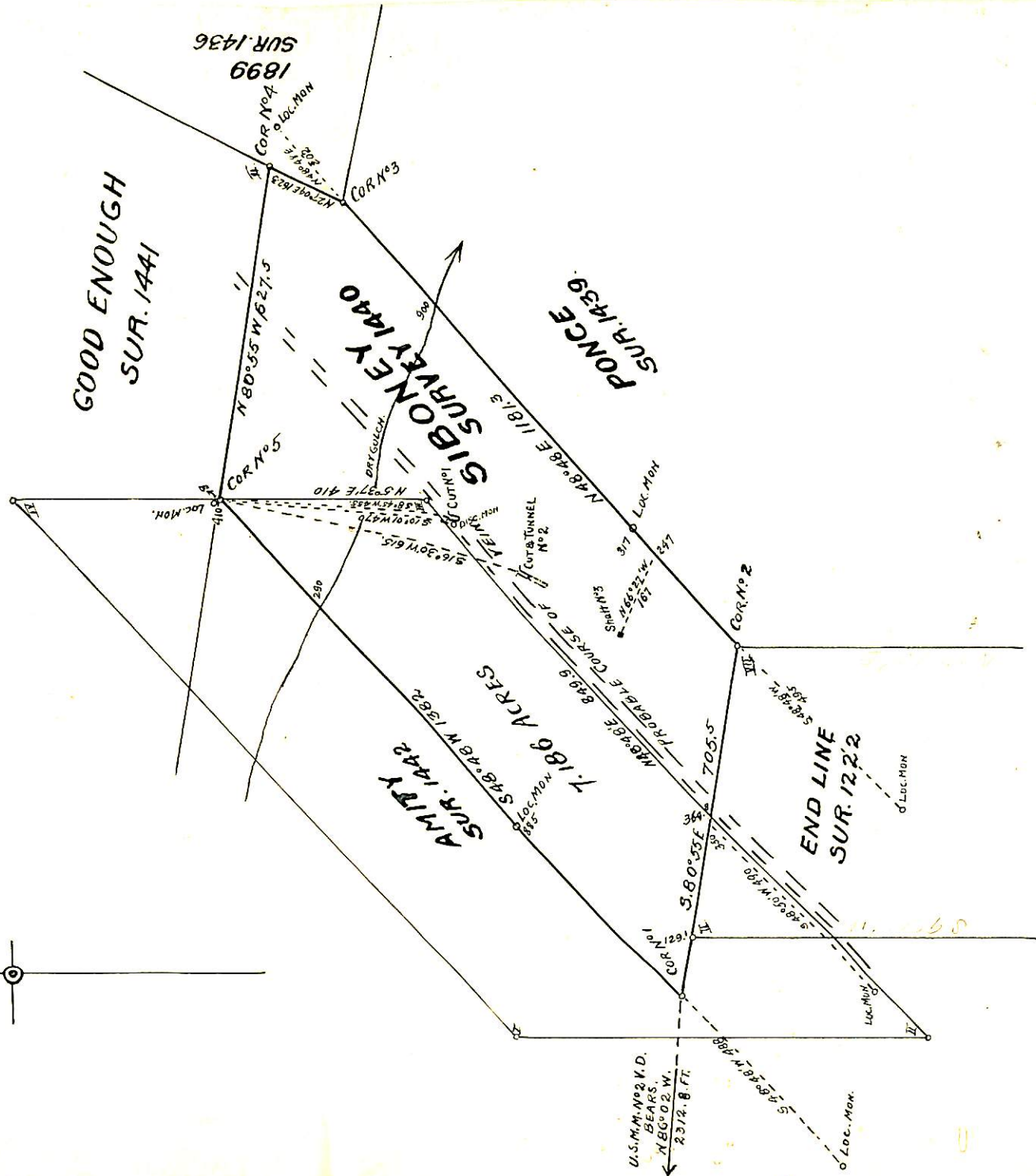
