NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.
Quartz Claim.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This mining claim, the name of which is the Seep mining claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by W.A. Clark, the undersigned, on the 28th day of November, 1899.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred (1500) feet, and I claim one thousand feet in a southeasterly direction and five hundred feet in a northwesterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with three hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Southeast to the Northwest.

The claim is situated and located in the Verde Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about one half mile in a Southerly direction from Little Oak Creek.

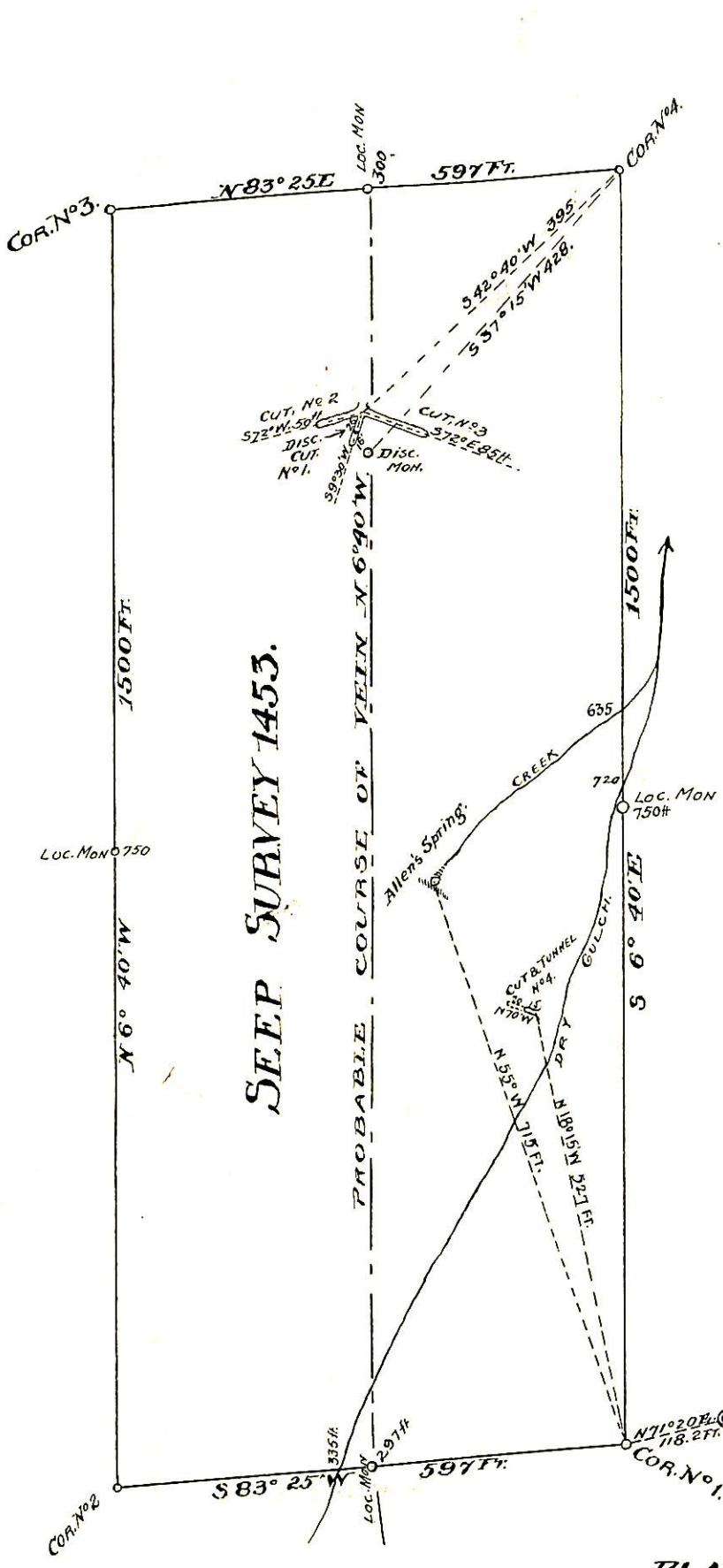

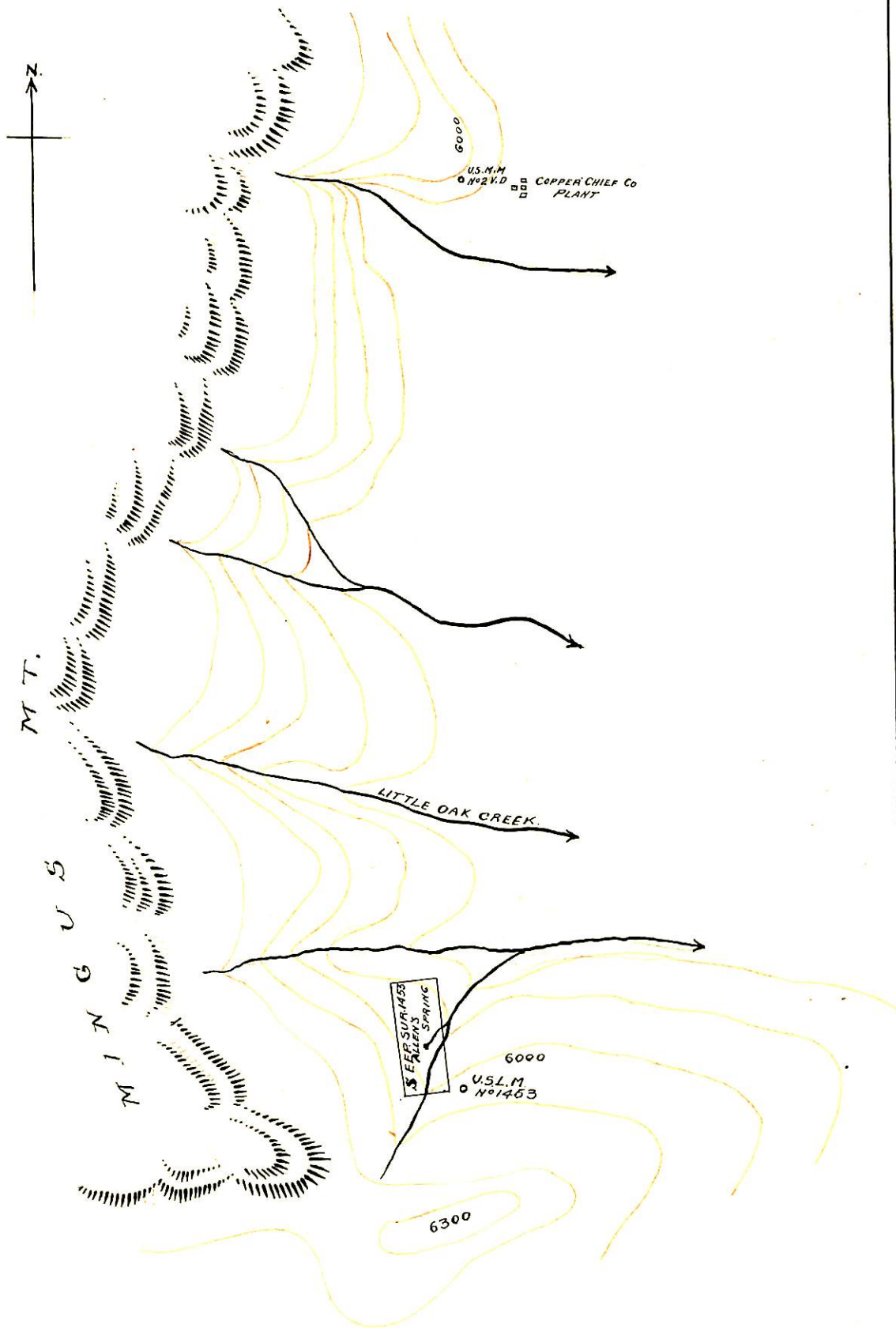
